

Trial resumes in Istanbul

ISTANBUL, Oct 23: The trial resumed here Monday of 20 Turks charged with involvement in the stabbing deaths of two British football fans ahead of a European Cup tie in April, but only four of the defendants ap-

peared in court, reports AFP. The suspects in attendance included Ali Demir, the main defendant who remains the only one to have admitted using a knife during street violence on April 5 ahead of a UEFA Cup game between Galatasaray and

Leeds United. Two British fans, Kevin Speight, 40, and Christopher Loftus, 36, were stabled to death during the melee.


All the suspects except Demir were released in an earlier hearing on the grounds that there was insufficient evidence to merit them being held in custody during the trial. Demir and four other sus-
