



Burglars took away Tk 46.79 lakh from a travel agency at Toyenbee Circular Road in the city's Motijheel area in the early hours of yesterday.

They entered the first floor office of Pan-Bright Travel Agency at 29 Toyenbee Circular Road by breaking the wall from an under construction building nearby.

The burglars broke open three lockers and looted Tk 46,79,200. Police said the incident might have taken place between 12 midnight and 4 am yesterday.

Ruhul Amin Mithu, managing director of the office, filed a case with Motijheel police in this regard. None was arrested till writing of this report last night, police said.

She was taken to a local clinic where attending doctor declared her dead.

Kafrul police said late last night that none came to the police station to file any case in this connection. Police failed to give any details of the incident.
