

Faridpur Medical College Hospital riddled with problems

FARIDPUR, Nov 14: The 250-bed Faridpur Medical College Hospital (FMCH) set-up in 1995 on 6.8 acres of land on Faridpur-Barisal Highway in plagued with manifold problems depriving a large number of patients of proper treatment.

Problems include shortage of beds, medicines, employees, ward masters, nurses, Ayas, transports, dietary items and operation theatres (OTs).

While visiting the hospital recently, this correspondent found from the admission register book that 450 patients in all were staying in different wards of the hospital on the day where as the hospital has a capacity to accommodate only 200 patients.

The staff including doctors, nurses, office employees, forth class employees and sweepers are far short of the requirements for 450 to 500 patients on average staying in the hospital. As supplied medicines, dietary items, beds, equipment and furniture are supplied as per the requirements of a 200 bed hospital which is far below the present requirements, according to acting superintendent of the hospital.

Each ward and corridor of the hospital appears like a busy railway station. Patients are kept on the floors, corridor, even on any vacant place of the hospital building in a most unhygienic condition. It can better be imagined than to give description of the state of hellish affairs prevailing and the standard of treatment administered.

When interviewed some patients said that no medicine whatsoever are supplied to them from the hospital. The attending doctors admitted that no costly medicines are supplied to the patients. Most sub-standard diets are given to the patients, they alleged.

Most unhygienic condition has been prevailing in the areas of latrines and urinals meant for the patients in each ward. Human stool is found piled up on the mouth of the latrines emitting pungent smell vitiating the total atmosphere of the area.

Staff nurses and Ayas in each ward have been facing acute problem to attend their natural calls. Lavatory in each ward meant for nurses and Ayas has virtually turned into a jam-packed store-room hindering their easy access to the lavatory.

Education of the Medical College students is being greatly hampered as the college hospital and the college are situated four kilometres apart.

Students of the college are imparted theoretical education in the college building situated in the heart of the town and they both male and female reside in the dormitories on the college campus. But they have to attend their practical classes at the college hospital at Harukandi on the outskirts of the town facing great inconveniences.

Similar is the case with the nurse students.

Prime minister Sheikh Hasina at a big public meeting held at Rajendra Varsity College ground nearly two years ago declared upgradation of the college hospital from 250 to 500 beds on priority basis.

It is a matter of great regret that the prime minister's pledge has not been fully implemented as yet.

The prime minister's kind attention is hereby drawn to immediately upgrade the Faridpur Medical College Hospital to 500-bed hospital with all requirements.

People of Faridpur demand integration of medical college, dormitories, quarters for doctors, nurses and other employees and the medical college hospital on existing hospital campus where sufficient land is available.

It integrated, the teachers, students, nurses and other employees will get better facilities to render their services to the patients and the students.

BSS from Feni reports: Dagonbhuiyan Health Complex, comprising of 31 beds, is facing manifold problems causing immense suffering to the local people.

The problems are: shortage of physicians, medicines and ambulances, supply of below standard food, lack of x-ray and pathological facilities and overall absence of security to patients and hospital staffs.

There are nine sanctioned posts of medical officers in the health complex including Upazila Health and Family Planning Officer (Administrator), but there are only two physicians now in the health complex including the Administrator and the Medical Officer of Maternity, Child and Family Planning Department. There were two more medical officers. Of them, one is on leave and the other is on deputation to Chittagong Medical College Hospital for a long time. As a result it is now difficult to look after the indoor patients, outdoor patients including all other health care services by these two physicians.

Every day, more than 200 patients visit outdoors and 20 to 25 patients are admitted to indoor, but they do not get proper medicare, it is alleged.

Tk 35.25cr fish resources washed away in Satkhira

SATKHIRA, Nov 14: Fish resources worth about Taka 35.25 crore were damaged by the unprecedented floods in the district, according to local Fisheries Department sources.

The floods have damaged about 1,024 shrimp farms, 6433 ponds, 191 nursery ponds, 30 hatcheries and 3 baors (water bodies).

According to preliminary estimate, shrimp worth Taka 28.51 crore, fish worth Taka 5.62 crore in ponds, fish valued at Taka 57 lakh in nursery ponds, fish worth Taka 23 lakh in hatcheries and fish valued at Taka 32 lakh in baors were washed away.

Fisheries Department officials said the loss by the devastating floods, were rare in the south-western region, will cast an adverse impact on fish supply in markets.

According to upazila-wise break-up, shrimp worth about

Taka 17.50 crore has been washed away in Debhata, Taka 2.86 crore in Tala, Taka 6.14 crore in Assassuni, Taka one crore in Sadar and Taka 1.5 crore in Kalaroa.

On the other hand, fish worth Taka 2.41 crore from ponds has been washed away in Sadar, Taka 2.18 crore in Kalaroa, Taka 7 lakh in Tala, and Taka 5 lakh in Assassuni upazilas.

Besides, fish fries worth Taka 33 lakh from nursery ponds in Kalaroa and Taka 22 lakh in Debhata and Taka 23 lakh in Kalaroa upazila have been washed away.

Fisheries Department sources said fishing inputs including nets and boats amounting to Taka 63 lakh were also damaged by the floods.

District Fisheries Department has already sent a proposal to the higher authorities for the rehabilitation of fishery sector.

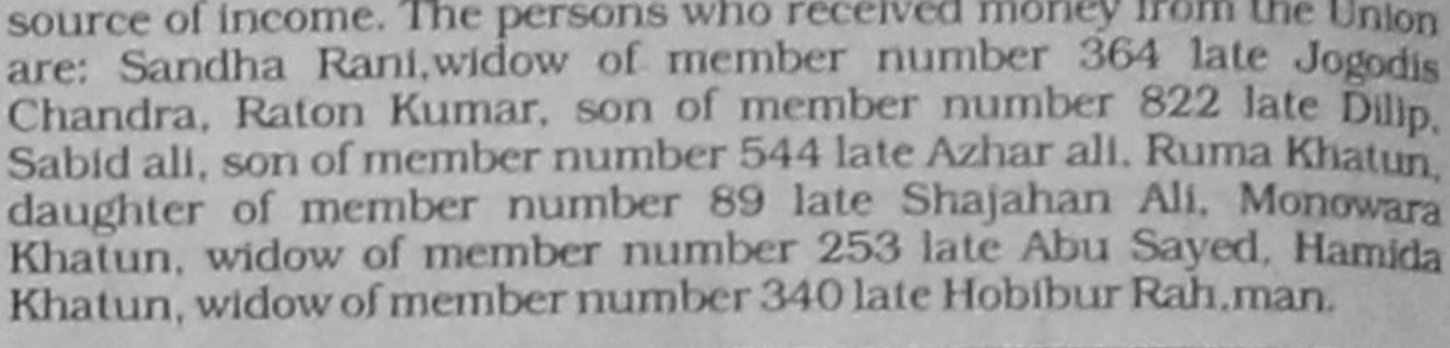
Truck workers' welfare activity

AL leader killed

KISHOREGANJ, Nov 14: An Awami League leader and former UP chairman was killed by unidentified assailants near Hajipur Bazaar in Nandail upazila Sunday night, reports UNB.

The victim was identified as Abu Taher, 60, former chairman of Zinari Union and president of local Awami League. He came under attack while returning home from Dewanganj Bazaar. He was rushed to Hossainpur Upazila Health Complex where the attending doctors pronounced him dead. He is believed to have been killed following a land dispute. A case was filed with local police in this connection against 17 people. Meanwhile, Deputy Speaker Adv Abdul Hamid in a statement Monday strongly condemned the killing of the Awami League leader.

Conviction

NAOGAON, Nov 14: A court here has sentenced three people, including a woman and her son, to different jail terms for possessing phensidyl, reports UNB.

Court sources said Kanok Prova was sentenced to two years rigorous imprisonment and fined Tk 5,000 in default, to suffer 15 days more RI. The court has also sentenced her son Prathust Kumar alias Bablu and Mosharraf Hossain Mondal to 14 years RI with a fine of Tk 5,000. They will have to suffer imprisonment for another year in default. According to the prosecution, police on information arrested Kanok, Bablu and Mosharraf along with 885 bottles of phensidyl on June 7, 1998. Mosharraf was tried in absentia. After examining the records and witnesses, the court pronounced the judgement on November 8.

Good Aman output in Moulvibazar likely

Pests play havoc with paddy in Feni

MOULVIBAZAR, Nov 14: Officials of the district Agriculture Extension Department (AED) are optimistic about bumper yield of Aman paddy this year in Moulvibazar district though floods and cyclonic storm damaged Aman cultivation in some areas.

Some villages under Kulaura, Rajnagar and Kamalgonj upazilas were hit by natural calamities like

floods, cyclone.

According to Moulvibazar district AED, a total of one lakh 6 thousand 462 hectares of land was brought under Aman cultivation though the target of cultivation was one lakh 3 thousand hectares. The achievement of cultivation has exceeded the target. Out of the total land, 71,335 hectares were brought under high yielding variety and

35,170 hectares under local variety. The AED officials added that of the total cultivated land 20,072 hectares were brought under Aman farming in Sadar upazila, 14,980 hectares in Srimongal upazila, 25,285 hectares in Kulaura upazila, 14,100 hectares in Rajnagar upazila, 22,000 hectares in Kamalgonj upazila and 70,025 hectares in Baralekha upazila.

Late rainfall in October appeared as a blessing for Aman farmers because it helped a lot for growth of paddy.

However, in Kamalgonj upazila, paddy on a vast tract of land in Adampur, Alnagar, Kamalgonj and Patan Usher unions were damaged due to cyclonic storm and flood by Dholai river water through breaches at the embankment. Aman paddy lands under Kamarchak union of Rajnagar upazila were also damaged as flood water submerged the paddy land through old breaches of the Monu river embankment.

On the other hand in Baralekha upazila paddy was attacked by pests. Official sources said a total of 130 hectares of land in this upazila came under pest attack and 12 hectares of land of Rajnagar upazila also came under pest attack. The district AED already allocated insecticides from their stock to combat the situation which is now under control.

Executive Engineer of Bangladesh Water Development Board, Moulvibazar said, stagnant water from the Kawadighi haor were pumped out, but it was not fruitful as water level of the River

Kushiyara which flows near the Kawadighi haor was much more higher than that of the haor. As a result, about 6 thousand hectares of land in this haor remained uncultivated in the current Aman season.

UNB from Feni says: Aman production here seems to fall far short of the target this season due to massive pest attack and inadequate rain.

Witnesses said Aman paddies on a vast tract of land in Parshuram, Chhagalnaiya and Sadar upazilas could not mature for lack of rain during the growing period of plants.

The flow of water from Muhuri Irrigation Project in Sonagazi upazila was also very inconsistent, as most of the sluice gates of the project kept open throughout the monsoon.

Besides, water from Baromashi Canal could not enter into the water bodies since Indian authorities closed different sluice gates in Belonia area.

The water crisis aside, pests played havoc with Aman paddy in Chhagalnaiya, Parshuram, Dagon Bhuiyan and Sadar upazilas, destroying crops worth crores of taka.

But Agriculture Extension Department has not yet been able to take any steps to control the pest attack.

In the current season, some 69,000 hectares of land have been brought under Aman cultivation, including 50,000 hectares under high yielding variety and 19,000 hectares under local variety, with an output target of 3 lakh tons.
