

## Red list on endangered wildlife

At least 13 species of vertebrate animals have disappeared in Bangladesh during the last century according to a book. The Red List of Threatened Animals of Bangladesh, published by the International Union of Conservation of Nature (IUCN).

The publication, brought out with assistance from the German and Dutch embassies in Bangladesh, also reveals that 54 varieties of fish, eight types of amphibians, 58 classes of

## Give money, not advice, agri minister tells WB

Agriculture Minister Begum Matia Chowdhury has urged the World Bank to provide money instead of giving advice always.

"It is not expected that you would deliver papers every year, containing various suggestions without providing money," she said yesterday while addressing as chief guest a WB sponsored seminar in the city.

"We do not need so much advice. We are ready to accept your suggestions--no matter how difficult those are--only if you provide money along with those," she said.

She urged the WB to extend all out co-operation for development of the country's economy.

## 2 electrocuted in city

Two people were electrocuted at Hazaribagh in the city yesterday.

### Mystery shrouds death of Boalmari UNO

TANGAIL, Nov 18: Mystery shrouds the death of Boalmari Upazila Nirbahi Officer Abdul Halim Mia, 40, on Tuesday at his official residence, reports UNB.

Following a General Diary (GD) filed with the police here autopsy was done on the body of Halim in Tangail General Hospital. Doctors said the reason behind the death could be ascertained after examination of his viscera.

Halim was found dead at his official residence at Boalmari in Faridpur district and subsequently the body was sent to his village home at Anahola of Ghatia upazila in Tangail.

He was posted in Boalmari two months ago where he was living without his family. He left behind wife and two children.

### One chopped to death in N'ganj

A young man was chopped to death by unidentified miscreants at Kainpur in Narayanganj on Friday.

The victim was identified as Abdul Barek, 30, a shepherd and son of Joynal Majumder of South Sayerpur, Fatullah, Narayanganj.

The miscreants chopped him indiscriminately at about 7pm. He was rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital in a critical condition where he died at about 10-40 pm on Friday.

The body was sent to the DMCH morgue for autopsy.

The victim left behind his two daughters and a son.

## Road accident kills 4 in Laksam

COMILLA, Nov 18: Four people, including two children and a woman, were killed and 20 others injured in a road accident at Shani Chowk in Laksam upazila today, reports UNB.

Among the dead were Hossie Ara Akhter, 20, wife of Babul Mia of Ashwadia village in Langolok upazila of the district, and her two months old daughter. The two others were a boy, 8, and a youth, 22.

Witnesses said the accident took place when a bus from Dhaka collided with another bus coming from opposite direction at about 11.30 am.

Babul Mia and his son, Shuvo, who received injuries, were sent to district Medical College Hospital.


A notice for sale of the shares, issued by Biman, was published in The Daily Star and in the inter-
