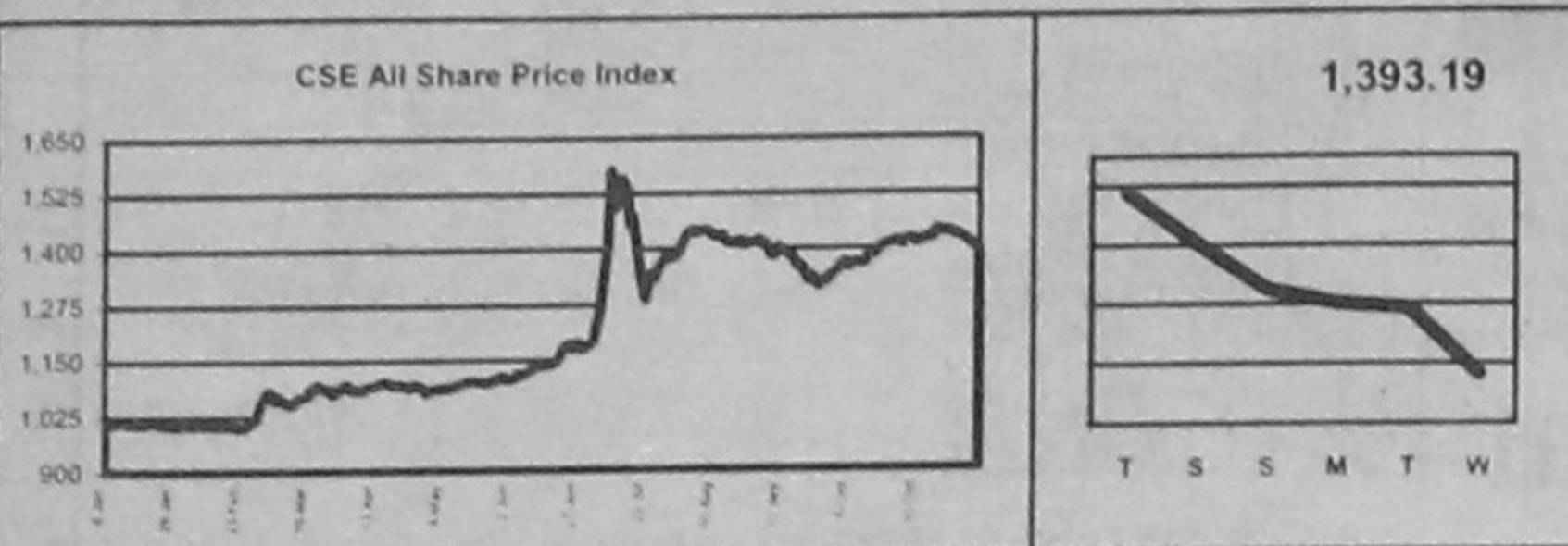
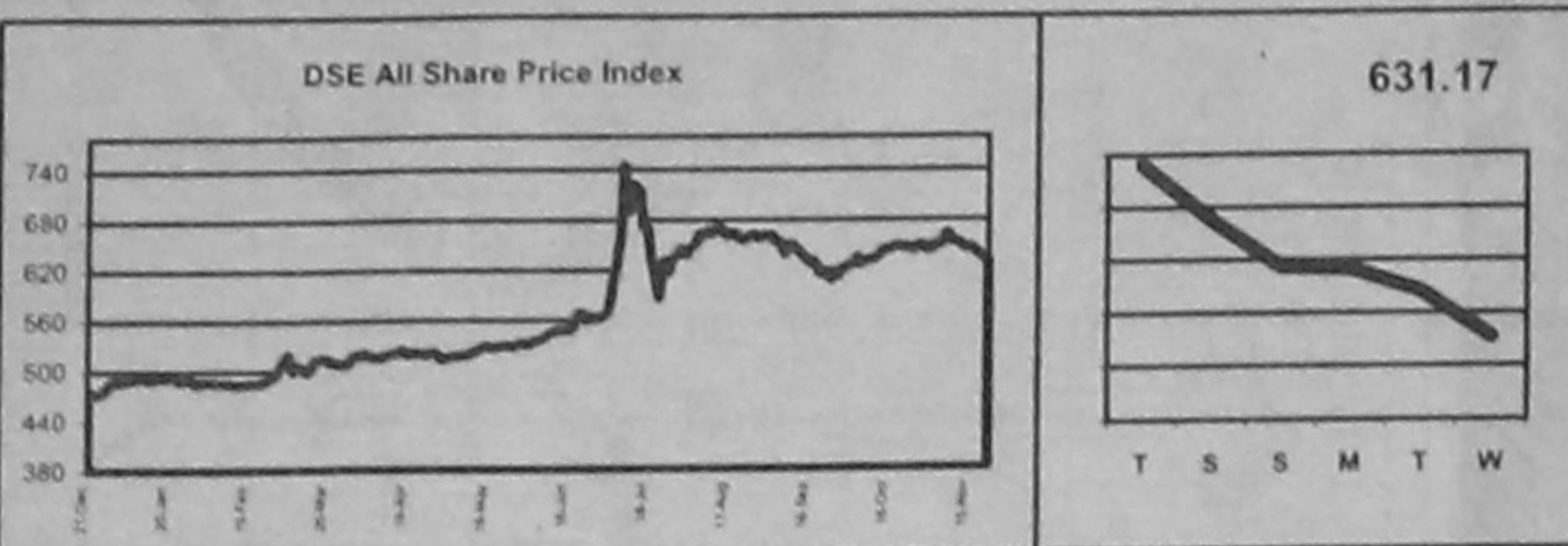
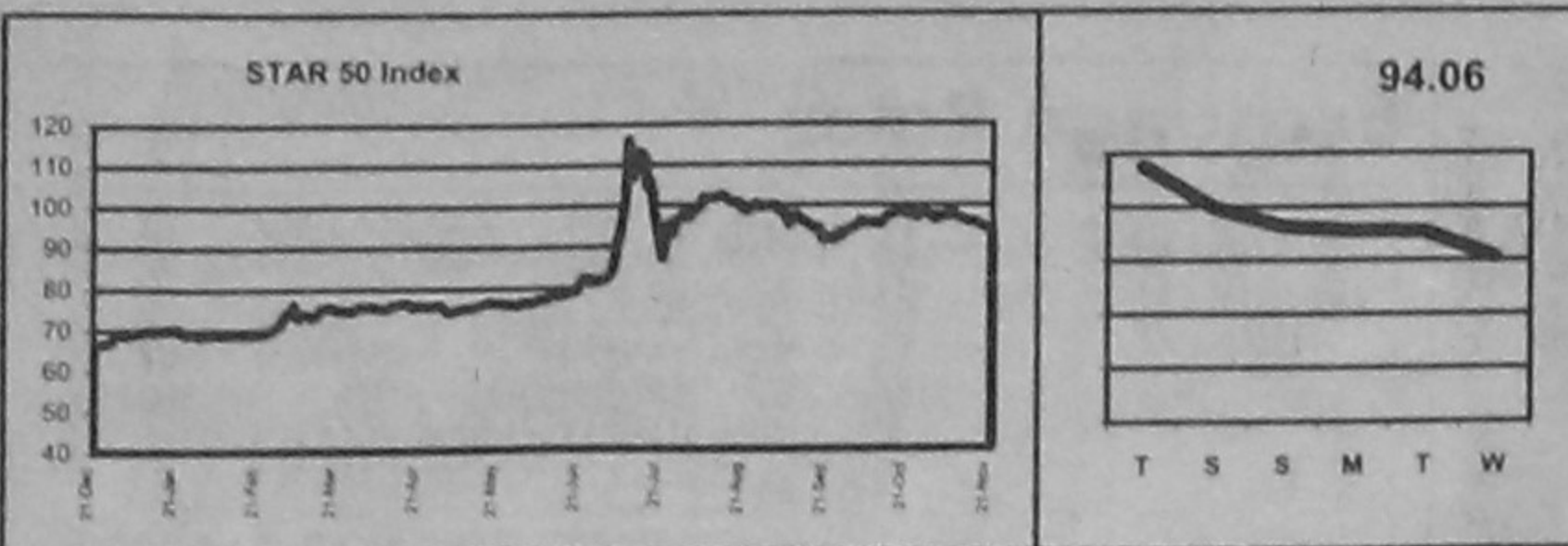

The DRU leaders also voiced concern over not giving membership to reporters and refrain from such misbehaviour.

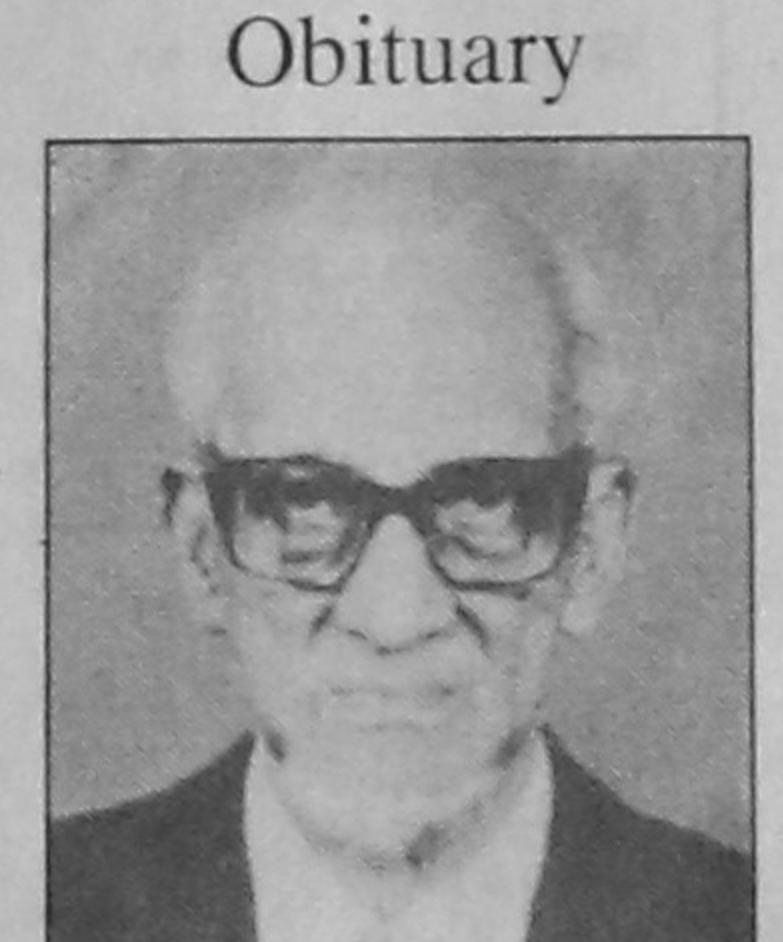
They urged the club authorities to take immediate measures for giving membership to reporters and refrain from such misbehaviour.
