The survey was conducted among of 69 women journalists of 20 dailies, three magazines and five news agencies. It reveals that 26.63 per cent women journalists complained of discrimination. The survey revealed that 36.67 per cent women journalists do

not get salary as per wage board.

Only seven per cent of total 53.33 per cent do not get transport facilities provided by the office while 53.33 per cent respondents complained of working outside job description.
