SL strikes deal with World Sports

COLOMBO, Nov 24: The Sri Lanka cricket board has clinched a 25-million dollar television rights deal with The World Sports Group, based in Singapore, a spokesman said Friday, reports AP.

The three-year deal includes radio and internet transmission.

"This shows the value of Sri Lanka cricket," said Chandris Perera, spokesman for Board of Control for Cricket in Sri Lanka.

The board's chief executives, Dhammika Ranatunga, was suspended last week after accusing colleagues of using irregular procedures to shortlist companies for the television rights.

The Board ordered an investigation into his allegations. No details are available.

Gold Flake Open from Jan 1

MADRAS, Nov 24: For the first time in three years, the Gold Flake Open tennis tournament in southern India will have no Grand Slam winners when it opens Jan 1, reports AP.

The top draws for the five-year-old tournament are Magnus Norman of Sweden, ranked No 4 in the ATP tour, Juan Carlos Ferrero, ranked 12, Franco Squillari of Argentina, at 14, and 16th-ranked Cedric Pioline of France.

Jerome Golmard of France, ranked 41, will be defending its singles title in the tournament, which in past years has featured stars like Boris Becker.

"This time we have decided to go for depth of field rather than have a Grand Slam winner as a star attraction," ATP executive director Brad Drewett said Friday. "If for any reason the star player gets knocked out in the first round, like it happened to Becker three years ago, or the player goes down with an injury, like it happened to Carlos Moya two years ago, the tournament can lose its charm."

Inness dashes SA's hopes

MELBOURNE, Nov 24: Victorian left-arm pacesman Mathew Inness needed just two deliveries Friday to ensure South Australia would not be taking any points in the battle of the Sheffield Shield's bottom teams, reports AFP.

Both teams came into the match without a point after two matches and it is South Australia who appear destined to remain on the bottom of the table after Inness routed them for just 96.

Inness equalled his best first-class figures of 6-26, set less than a week ago against the West Indies, with the highlight being the key wickets of Greg Blewett and Darren Lehmann with his first two deliveries of the match.

Croft can't bear it

BRISBANE, Nov 24 (Reuters/APF): Former West Indian cricket star Colin Croft said the current West Indies team should be sent home in disgrace after their poor start to the first cricket Test against Australia.

"Unless there is a startling improvement in the second innings then the agony should not be prolonged," the retired fast bowler wrote in a column for The Australian newspaper.

"The embarrassment, to players of both sides, for obviously varying reasons, and the insult to paying patrons must not be allowed to continue."

Croft, who played for West Indies when they were the undisputed kings of world cricket in the late 1970s and 1980s, said Australia would be better off playing Bangladesh than West Indies.

"It is like going to a circus, with the West Indies cricketers, though of as clowns," Croft said after having experienced the West Indies' debacles against Pakistan (3-0), South Africa (5-0), New Zealand (3-0) and even England (3-1), what happened on Thursday was hardly a surprise.

"But, while the level of performance in their 82 all-out was not unexpected, it has become an embarrassment. With this approach this Test series could

become a pointless exercise. The West Indies, it seems, are completely lost when it comes to the effort, energies and concentration levels that are required to play Test cricket."

"It has come to such a sorry state of affairs now that this Test series is likely to be so devalued the best course of action would be to send the current team home."

"No team in the '70s and '80s that was beaten by the Windies when they were in their prime could have been as hapless as the West Indies looked at the Gabba."

Another former West Indies great, Michael Holding, said he was also at a loss to explain the current team's sudden fall from grace.

Working as a commentator on Australian television, Holding said there was no obvious reason why the team was performing so poorly.

West Indies have not won a series away from home in four years and earlier this year suffered the embarrassment of losing to England for the first time in 32 years.

"I cannot fathom it. I have tried to evaluate things and why things have been happening but I have given up on those things," Holding said.

"When they are away from home, they look like a bunch of schoolboys and don't look as if they belong out there."

Fed Cup final

Americans hold all aces

LAS VEGAS, Nov 24 (AFP): Monica Seles dominates them. A quick indoor carpet surface frustrates them. And all the odds are against them here in the United States' gambling Mecca.

But longshots Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario and Conchita Martinez will make a bid to take the Fed Cup home to Spain by dethroning the favoured hosts in the best-of-five final Friday and Saturday for the women's world team tennis crown.

World No. 4 Seles meets fifth-ranked Martinez in the opener with Sanchez, ranked ninth and going against No. 2 Lindsay Davenport in the second match Friday. Foes are reversed for matches Saturday followed by a concluding doubles match.

"Lindsay and Monica are favourites. And they're very strong," Martinez said. "Seles is playing great and Lindsay is a great player. They're at home on their surface and I'm sure they will be pumped up to win it."

"It's always tough to play on this surface. It's pretty fast. They play well on this surface. We like clay and outdoors. It's a

big advantage for them. But anything can happen. We will do our best."

Nine-time Grand Slam champion Seles is 18-1 lifetime against Martinez, whose lone triumph over Seles came at Stanford in 1997, and 19-3 against Sanchez, who last beat Seles in the 1998 French Open final.

"Monica has a great record against both of them," Davenport said. "Neither of them like to play her. We know that. So the team is like, 'Just get one of your matches and we will be fine.' I'm just looking for Monica to keep doing what she does against them."

Martinez has taken only one set off Seles in her 18 defeats, but Spanish captain Miguel Margets said having played indoor WTA events the past few weeks will help Martinez fare better against Seles.

"The important thing is she can play without pressure," he said. "She has to try not to think about it. This is a new match. She has the chance to turn back history and it's good chance to try."

Both Spaniards own winning ledgers over Davenport, but not lately. Martinez is 8-5 against the Australian Open champion.

but has lost their past three meetings, including a Philadelphia semifinal two weeks ago.

Sanchez is 7-4 against this year's Wimbledon and US Open runner-up but has lost four of the past six.

"Conchita and I have played for Spain for 10 years," Sanchez said. "We have been in this situation before. We've just got to stay focused."

The Spanish have won four of their past five Cup meetings with the US team, taking each one on clay but losing 5-0 indoors in 1996 at Atlantic City.

"Surface plays a big part of it and this is the best surface we could have," Davenport said. "This court is much better for Monica and I than the one in Spain. Indoors gives us a big advantage. On clay, maybe we could see it as more of a grudge match."

Seles, a WTA Championship finalist loser last week to Martina Hingis, knows what to expect from her rivals and the surface.

"The balls bounce high on this court. I have to be aggressive and not let it be over my shoulder level," Seles said. "And I know Conchita is going to hit some great backhands and Arantxa is going to chase down every ball."
