was allocated on a temporary basis. By approving the shops Mayor violated a resolve them. directive issued earlier by the prime minister banning construction on open or public places or low-lying areas of the city.

Several plot owners in the commercial area. area of Karwan Bazar have welcomed the prime minister's step to look into the problems in this area. They said they were thankful to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for taking action against such practices.
