## Foreign ship catches fire at Ctg port

CHITTAGONG, Dec 3: A foreign cargo ship anchored at Chittagong port jetty No 1 caught fire this evening, causing damage to 2000 tons of copra (dried coconut), port and police sources said.

The Antigua flag carrier Southern Queen arrived at Chittagong port on December 1 loaded with copra imported from Australia, port sources said.

The ship caught fire in its hatch at 5.30 pm. All the 14 Sri Lankan crew left the ship unhurt, police said.

Fire fighters rushed to the spot and extinguished the blaze at 9 pm.

Port's fire fighting vehicles also joined the operation.

The dried coconuts were imported by private parties for extracting coconut oil in the factory, sources said.

Sources said the fire reportedly broke out at the time of welding inside the ship.

The port authority has formed a three-member body to probe the fire incident and ascertain the extent of damage.

## Anti-peace accord activists clash with AL men at Bandarban:

**35 injured**

BANDARBAR, Dec 3: At least 35 people were injured, five of them seriously, in a clash between the activists of anti-peace accord and Awami League here today, reports BSS.

Police said the anti-peace accord activists of Chittagong Hill Tracts under the banner of four-party opposition alliance clashed with the ruling party men after a rally in the town.

The anti-peace accord activists tried to set fire to the Modhampara residence of Juba League worker Abdul Barez and stabbed two employees of a furniture shop.

They also attacked the residence of District Chhatra League president Luxminanda Pal.

The injured were admitted to Bandarban Sadar Hospital.

General Secretary of district Awami League Abdur Rahim Chowdhury told BSS that they will file a case against the attackers with Sadar Police Station. He also condemned and protested the attack.

## Tussle reaches climax Three ECs reject CEC's position

The tussle between the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) and the three Election Commissioners reached its climax yesterday with both sides refusing to budge from their stance over the controversial appointments of a foreign consultant and some IT experts to an Election Commission (EC) project.

In their reply to CEC MA Syed's letter yesterday, the three Election Commissioners Abidur Rahman, Moshtaq Ahmed Chowdhury and Saifur Rahman said that their decision to reverse the CEC's illegal decision on the appointments was legitimate and cannot be declared void.

MA Syed told journalists before receiving the letter that his decision was right and it is not subject to change. "Twas right and I will always be right."

Hinting at the Election Commissioners, he said some people are trying to make the Commission ineffective, and that's why they are raising objection to the appointments.

Abidur Rahman, the senior most Election Commissioner who was acting as the Chief Election Commissioner during Syed's absence (he was on a trip to the US), said there was no provision for such consultant in the project. The CEC proposed to the UNDP for hiring Lionel J Wolner as a consultant. "But, we don't know why he did this."

About downsizing of the EC, which has been reportedly proposed by the CEC, he said there

should be no objection to the proposal if the Commission works properly. But, it should be kept in mind that one could become an autocrat by taking advantage of such a move.

Moshtaq Ahmed Chowdhury and Saifur Rahman, the two other commissioners, said their position was ethical. The question is whether the process through which the Election Commission will work will be transparent or not, they said.

In a four-page joint letter, the three Election Commissioners called for an immediate investigation into the appointments of the foreign consultant and others in the "Strengthening the Election Commission Project," which is funded by the UNDP.

The letter was sent to the CEC in the afternoon by a messenger, according to the EC sources.

"The authority cannot be challenged just for the sake of raising some illegal decisions and their annulment in a Commission meeting," the commissioners said.

The Commission's decision shall be confirmed by the Commission and there have been such precedence, they noted in the letter which contained 10 points explaining the Constitution, conventions and the existing laws pertaining to the Election Commission.

Chief Election Commissioner MA Syed giving his

## 4 airlines want to become Biman's strategic partner

Four airlines have sent Request for Proposal (RFP) to become a Strategic Partner (SP) of Bangladesh Biman through buying 40 per cent of its shares under a restructuring programme.

The Gulf Air and the Qatar Airways have sent their RPs directly to Biman. The Singapore Airlines and the Air New Zealand have sent their RPs to the Citibank Group, Biman's consultant for the proposed restructuring, Biman sources said.

The last date of sending RFP was December 2. It may be extended since some more airlines have shown interest, the sources said but declined to name those.

The issue of inducting new generation aircraft ahead of finalising sale of the proposed 40 per cent shares to a SP came under criticism by different quarters.

The RFP for sale of the DC-10-30 aircraft and lease or purchase of Airbus A 340 or Boeing 777-200 aircraft.

"We would like to complete the process but leave the choice of the aircraft to the SP," a Biman source said.

Advertisements inviting RFP were published in The Daily Star, The Economist and the Flight International on November 17.

Tender in this regard is likely to be floated towards the end of this month.

The restructuring is being designed by the Citibank Group under a two million dollar World Bank aided project.

Under the programme, the government will retain 51 percent shares of Biman and give nine percent to its employees.

However, Biman will retain ground handling, cargo and catering services.

Meanwhile, Biman authorities are rethinking sale of its four DC-10-30 aircraft to lease or purchase four Airbus A 340 or Boeing 777-200 aircraft.

"We would like to complete the process but leave the choice of the aircraft to the SP," a Biman source said.

The issue of inducting new generation aircraft ahead of finalising sale of the proposed 40 per cent shares to a SP came under criticism by different quarters.

The RFP for sale of the DC-10-30 aircraft and lease or purchase of Airbus A 340 or Boeing 777 was published in newspapers in October. The last date for submission of RFP was November 14.

Ershad's lawyer asked to reply whether his client talked to the judge

A Division Bench of the High Court yesterday ordered former President HM Ershad's attorney to obtain from the attorney of the daily Manab Jamin a transcript of his client's alleged conversation with a High Court judge following his conviction in the Janata Tower case.

The Bench comprising Justice Syed Amirul Islam and Justice K.M. Shafiuuddin also asked Ershad's attorney Khandaker Mabub Hossain to give a reply on December 10 whether his client had talked with the judge and the transcript was that of his client.

## SC rejects Ershad's plea for paying fine in installments

The Appellate Division of the Supreme Court yesterday dismissed an appeal by former president HM Ershad for payment of the Tk 5.5 crore fine in installments and for his release from jail on bail bond. He was convicted in the Janata Tower case.

A Full Bench of the Appellate Division headed by Chief Justice Latifur Rahman gave the verdict. The other judges were Justice Kazi Ebadul Haq, Justice Mahmudul Amin Chowdhury and Justice Mainur Reza Chowdhury.

Ershad filed the leave petition against an earlier judgement of the Appellate Division that upheld a lower court verdict which sentenced him of five years' imprisonment and to pay a fine of Tk 5.5 crore in the case.

The Appellate Division, however, modified the High Court

judgement saying Ershad could come out from jail on payment of the penalty. It also reduced the jail term from two years to a six-

month in default of payment of the fine.

Ershad has already served three years, seven months and 26 days in jail in the case until 1997. He was later freed on bail on January 9, 1997.

He was again sent to jail on November 20 this year to complete the sentence by the Appellate Division on a graft charge stemming from a high rise building called Janata Tower at Kawran Bazar, Dhaka. He allegedly built the tower beyond his legal or known source of income.

The conviction on a charge of "moral turpitude" by the highest court has disqualified the former President from remaining a Member of Parliament and from contesting in parliament election for five years from the date he would be released.

## Ghorasal-6 sets tripping record 30 times in 23 months of commercial operation

The sixth unit of Ghorasal power plant tripped again on December 2 for the 30th time since it started operations nearly 23 months back.

PDB officials attributed the temporary suspension of power generation to "minor technical problem." The problem, which suspended power supply for almost seven hours from 2-45 in the afternoon, wouldn't recur in the near future, they hoped.

The Tk 670 crore project took a Russian company nearly five years to complete and started power generation on a commercial basis from January 30 last year. However, the unit couldn't reach its peak generation capacity 210 megawatt in its first one year and eight months of operations.

With the local experts taking over the maintenance operations, the performance of the unit also improved. It had uninterruptedly generated power to its full capacity for nearly two and a half months until Saturday's break-

down.

Although only 23-month old, Ghorasal-6 has a long history of tripping, the first one taking place within seven days of its inauguration.

Nonetheless the PDB official admitted that such a high frequency of shutdown was "unusual" and none of the other 62 power units in the country had so many breakdowns within such a short span.

From November 12 till Decem

Feud among the top crime rings of the capital has again intensified following the killing of two members of a crime ring at a flat at East Rampura recently, sources said.

The underworld dons are now consolidating their position to face each other following the killings, according to sources who fear more killings at any time due to the conflict between the two criminal groups.

Police recovered decomposed bodies of two young men from the third floor of a flat at East Rampura on Friday and identified them as Suman and John, members of Seven Star group, a crime ring of some notorious criminals in the city.

Sources said the killings were sequel to the triple murders in the city's Gopibagh area in August. Decomposed bodies of Asif, leader of a crime gang in Gopibagh area, and two of his associates were recovered inside a flat at Gopibagh on August 29.

Police suspected that members of the Seven Star group killed them following a feud over sharing of extorted money. Soon after the killings, Mamun, brother of Asif, took over the charge of the group and waited to take revenge of his brother's murder.

Sources said Mamun was behind the killings at Rampura.

Police failed to find out reasons behind the killings. Khilgaon police, however, said the killing of Suman and John might some
