## Market on car park land: Rajuk issues showcase

Rajuk has sent a showcase notice to the Bangladesh Avenue Baboshayee Bohumukhi Samabai Samity (BABSS) asking it why the plan for a six-story building would not be cancelled since the FWD has confirmed that the land is a designated public car park.

Sources in Rajuk said when they were forced at gun-point to approve the plan on November 5, Rajuk's Building Construction Committee (BC Committee) tagged a condition that if there is any problem with the land, the approval would be automatically cancelled.

Rajuk has asked BABSS Secretary Dewan Nasirul Haque to respond in seven days.

## Italy to back preferential access of Bangladeshi items to EU

### Amato also assures continuation of GSP facilities

ROME, Dec 4: Italy today assured extending support for preferential access of Bangladeshi products to European Union market, continuation of GSP facilities and legalisation of the unauthorised immigrants, reports UNB.

The assurances came from Italian Prime Minister Giuliano Amato during official talks with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina.

"I assure Italy's support for the access of original products of Bangladesh to EU market and to GSP," Amato told newsmen after the talks billed "extremely successful." Apart from bilateral matters, regional and international issues also came up for discussion in the meeting.

The Italian Prime Minister said that his government would consider the issue of giving legal status to Bangladeshi citizens in Italy, and making an agreement on illegal Bangladeshi immigrants.

He said a large number of Bangladeshis are working in Italy and his government would take steps for their legalisation and at the same time the two governments would make an agreement so that more Bangladeshi immi-

grants could come here.

Amato also assured his government's help in flood protection and flood management in Bangladesh.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said the two countries would reach an agreement allowing more Bangladeshis to come to Italy through legal process. "We have also discussed the issue of regularisation of Bangladeshi nationals living in Italy. If we have an agreement, the people of Bangladesh will be able to come in larger numbers and work here without any obstruction," she told the journalists.

Giuliano Amato and Sheikh Hasina met the press after the official talks at Chigi Palace that lasted an hour. The two leaders said they had a very fruitful discussion on various bilateral and international issues.

The Italian Premier said: "We have focused on a number of bilateral issues as well as on the international scene." He congratulated Prime Minister Hasina on restoring democracy in Bangladesh and initiating programmes on economic development and bringing about a social change.

Amato said excellent bilateral relations

would help promote direct Italian investment in Bangladesh in telecom, infrastructure and other sectors. The visit will also generate business and production activities in Bangladesh.

Hasina, who is here on the first leg of her 3-nation European tour, said she had free and frank exchange of views with her Italian counterpart on various issues on bilateral, regional and international planes.

"We are grateful that Prime Minister Amato could appreciate many of the difficulties which Bangladesh, as a developing country, faces today as she strives for progress."

Describing Italy as an important trading and development partner, the PM said it is willing to participate in development process and economic activities in Bangladesh.

State Minister for Foreign Affairs Abul Hasan Chowdhury, Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister Dr S A Samad, Foreign Secretary CM Shafi Sami, Press Secretary to the Prime Minister Jawadul Karim and Bangladesh Ambassador to Italy M Ziauddin were present in the meeting.

## Laxmipur BCL leader held in Nurul Islam abduction case

LAXMIPUR, Dec 4: Police arrested a local leader of Chhatra League in connection with Advocate Nurul Islam abduction case early today, reports UNB.

Police arrested Moinul Islam Sumon, general secretary of Sadar upazila Chhatra League and a degree examinee, from his house upon a requisition from the investigation officer of the case.

He was produced in the court later on the day. The court placed him on a three-day police remand and also ordered to take him to CID Dhaka office for interrogation.

BNP leader Advocate Nurul Islam was kidnapped on the night of September 18 this year from the residence of his sister at Uttar Majipur in the town.

Police was informed within half an hour of his abduction but they could not take any initiative to rescue him.

On September 20, State Minister for Sports, Youth and Cultural Affairs Obaidul Quader in a meet

## 3 ECs now await President's intervention to resolve row

The Election Commissioners are counting on presidential intervention to end the standoff in the Election Commission (EC) over a row between them and the Chief Election Commissioner centring round the appointment of a foreign consultant and IT experts to an EC project.

"We cannot approach the President, but if the President calls us we will let him know every bit of the events taking place in the Election Commission," one of the Election Commissioners, preferring anonymity, told The Daily Star last night.

He believes President Shahabuddin Ahmed may summon the commissioners, as he is well aware of the happenings in the Election Commission. The three commissioners have called for an investigation into the EC through the Supreme Judicial Council, which also requires presidential approval.

"Election Commission is a constitutional body and, therefore any investigation into irregularity in it should be done by the Supreme Judicial Council," he said without elaborating.

Meanwhile, Chief Election Commissioner MA Syed is yet to go through the four-page joint letter containing reply of the three Election Commissioners although it was submitted to him on Sunday.

"I may give a reply or take any decision after going over the letter. It is a legal matter," he told newsmen at his office yesterday.

"My decision shall never be changed," he said

when asked whether the appointments would be cancelled. Syed maintained that the appointments were made appropriately.

He termed the demand by three commissioners to cancel the "illegal" appointments "unthinkable and unacceptable."

Officials said the CEC is yet to take any move to resolve the crisis in the EC. He has blamed press reports and the three Commissioners for the volatile situation persisting in the constitutional body.

But, the commissioners, who had reversed the CEC's decisions in several "Commission" meetings and later in their reply to the CEC's letter termed the appointments unlawful, were still hopeful of an amicable solution.

The three Election Commissioners Abidur Rahman, Moshtaq Ahmed Chowdhury and Shafiqur Rahman sent the joint letter to the CEC explaining their positions in reply to the CEC's November 26 letter, in which he challenged several decisions taken in his absence in several meetings.

Abidur Rahman, the senior most among the three Election Commissioners, said the matter would be resolved through talks in the Election Commission meeting, which is the proper forum.

When asked about the CEC's rigid position regarding the appointments, Rahman said, "It is his personal opinion, not the Commission's." The other day the CEC had said that nobody can remove the

## I wanted to uphold past glory of judiciary: Naimuddin

The Member of the Law Commission has been served with a show-cause notice for making 'derogatory and scandalous' remarks on the judiciary at an October 30 workshop in the city.

Justice Naimuddin Ahmed, Member of the Law Commission, yesterday appeared before a Division Bench of the High Court and submitted a written statement in response to a rule issued on him earlier.

The rule had asked him to show cause why contempt proceedings would not be drawn against him for making "derogatory and scandalous" remarks on the judiciary in a workshop in the city on October 30.

In his submission Justice Naimuddin said his comments "were entirely aimed at upholding the authority, dignity, honour and glory of an institution (the judiciary) to which I belonged and which is the last resort of the people."

The retired judge of the High Court appeared in person before the Bench comprising Justice Syed

Amirul Islam and AKM Shafiuddin. His written submission was read out to the court by his counsel barrister Amirul Islam.

About his observation of lack of devotion of some judges leading to piling up of cases, he said, "This expression was not contempt but self-analysis and an attempt to uphold the past glory of the judiciary."

He said, "I did not mean that all judges of Bangladesh or the judiciary in Bangladesh as a whole are devoid of any sense of values. I wanted to convey the message that among the judges also there are some persons who lack sense of values and dedication to duty and that is why cases have accumulated in the courts."

About his comments on delay in disposal of cases,

## BB takes step to streamline foreign exchange deal

As a major step in foreign exchange management, the Bangladesh Bank (BB) has adopted a band within which it will buy and sell dollars a decision many think as a step toward flexible exchange rate management.

The BB on Sunday decided that instead of transacting all purchases of dollar from authorised dealers at Tk 53.85 and sales at Tk 54.15, it will decide its buying and selling rates for each transaction separately within the band of Tk 53.85 to Tk 54.15, keeping in view the market situation.

Authorised dealers interested in selling to or buying dollars from the BB will make their offers or bids mentioning the amounts to be transacted and the proposed rates.

The BB shall in turn make inquiries from time to time with individual authorised dealers about the rates at which they will be interested in selling to or buying from it specified sums of dollars.

"This is a move to make our foreign exchange

regime more market oriented," said a BB high official. "It will help us effectively intervene in the market. It is a step toward having a floating exchange rate. In doing so, we have followed the example of India where there is a band for the central bank's dollar buying and selling. Sri Lanka has even gone beyond and removed any band."

A top official of BB said the central bank will eventually widen the band which will have an effective devaluation impact without any official currency adjustment.

Earlier, when the BB followed a fixed foreign exchange rate, it was impossible for the central bank to buy dollar from the market when the rate was higher than its purchase rate. At the same time, it also could not sell dollar to authorised dealers at rates higher than its fixed selling rate.

The country's banking circle yesterday greeted the BB move as a positive step. They said this will

## VC's house attacked SUST students go on rampage

SYLHET, Dec 4: Agitated students of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology went on the rampage and damaged property worth about Taka 10 lakh at the official residence of the Vice-Chancellor this afternoon.

They also burnt the effigy of the VC and assaulted some teachers.

The students were agitating to press for four-point demand. These are Taka 10 lakh compensation for a fellow student who was injured in a bus collision yesterday afternoon, assurance of his treatment, purchase of one ambulance and five buses for the students within a month and immediate suspension of varsity bus drivers responsible for the accident.

The agitating students laid a seize to the VC's residence at about 12:20 pm and handed over a memorandum to him.

Earlier they gave an ultimatum to meet their demands by 3 pm today.

Several teachers of the university came to the agitating students at about 1:30 pm and assured of taking steps against the drives, but the

## Build movement for people-oriented healthcare system

The People's Health Assembly 2000 (PHA), the biggest gathering of health activists from 95 countries, began in Savar yesterday.

Other than health activists, academicians, journalists, medical practitioners, human rights activists and environmentalists are attending the conference for action in favour of a people oriented movement for healthcare.

At the inaugural session of the five-day international meet, first of its kind being hosted by Gonoshasthya Kendra, Dr Gaseem Choudhury, coordinator of PHA Secretariat said, "Health for All should be a major part of the international development agenda."

"There is need to build an integrated movement for people oriented healthcare system as opposed to profit-driven global health industry."

PHA that brought together more than 3000 participants from across the globe is committed to the provision of a universal, participatory and comprehensive primary healthcare system irrespective of people's ability to pay.

"We oppose World Bank and government policies that privatise healthcare, turning it

into a commodity, and demand that World Health Organisation (WHO) strengthen its leadership in health," said one of the participants at the opening ceremony at the newly built assembly hall in the midst of a beautiful green atmosphere yesterday morning.

The venue is some 50 kilometres from then city.

"This is the beginning of a genuine movement for public healthcare. Human dignity should be at the centre of every political decision," said James Orbinski of Medecins Sans Frontieres of Canada.

Orbinski continued, "Today, more than 800 million people do not have access to healthcare facilities. The rich are becoming richer while the poor are getting poorer. The political responsibility has failed in many countries. Our goal is to bridge this gap through creating massive awareness about people's rights."

He added, "From this platform we want to use our voice to achieve our goals for a true movement. This is a long-term struggle against political injustice. It's time we unite for
