### JS body discusses trial of officers allegedly involved in '77 mutiny

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on the Ministry of Defence at a meeting yesterday discussed matters relating to the trial of Army and Air Force officers who were allegedly involved in a mutiny on October 2, 1977, an official handout said, reports BSS.  
The meeting, held at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban, also discussed in detail the measures undertaken for the welfare of the family members of the victim army officers who were killed along with Bangabandhu on the night of August 15, 1975 and November 7 of the same year and afterwards.  
Committee Chairman Major General (ret'd) K M Shafulah (Bir Udam) chaired the meeting which was attended by committee members Colonel (ret'd) Shawkat Ali, Mohammad Faruq Khan, Golam Mohammad Qader and Major (ret'd) Mohammad Akhteruzzaman.  
Defence Secretary M Idris Ali, Chief of the Army Staff Lt General Mustafizur Rahman, Navy Chief Rear Admiral Abu Taher, Air Force Chief Air Vice Marshal Jamal Uddin Ahmed and officials concerned were present.

### Narsingdi fire victims to get compensation on Dec 12

NARSINGDI, Dec 4: A meeting between Parliamentary Standing Committee on Commerce Ministry, BGMEA, and local political leaders today decided that the victims of the recent devastating fire at Chowdhury Knitwear Ltd here would be compensated on December 12, reports BSS.  
The meeting chaired by Commerce Minister Abdul Jalil decided that the owner of the knitwear would pay Tk one lakh to the families of each of the 39 workers died in the fire and Tk 5,000 to each of the injured.  
Besides, the management of the factory would pay the regular wages to the injured workers for their treatment and pay the outstanding wages to all factory workers.  
Under the agreement, the owners of the Knitwear unit would hand over the compensation in the presence of Science and Technology Minister Mohammad Nouruddin Khan here.

### 42 miscreants surrender with arms at Sirajganj

SIRAJGANJ, Dec 4: Forty-two miscreants of sadar and Kamarkhand thanas of the district today formally surrendered with arms to Home Minister Mohammad Nasim at a public rally here.  
Presided over by the Police Super of the district S M Mustafizur Rahman, the rally was addressed, among others, by Abdul Latif Mirza MP, Abdul Latif Biswas, DIG of Police for Rajshahi range Sirajul Islam, local Awami League leader Abu Yusuf Surju, Binol Kumar Das, Haji Ishaq Ali, local Union Parishad Chairman Namdar Ali and Amjad Ali.  
The miscreants surrendered 30 firearms led by Amzad Hossain and Helal Uddin of Bagbari under Kamarkhand Upazila. The surrendered miscreants were wanted in different murder cases including Saidabad UP chairman Belal Hossain, UP chairman Sahajan Ali and Moyazzam Sahajan.

## Supreme Court gives Bush temporary victory

WASHINGTON, Dec 4: In at least a temporary victory for Republican George W. Bush, the US Supreme Court today set aside a ruling that extended the deadline for hand-counted Florida ballots that Democrat Al Gore needs to win the White House, reports Reuters.  
The nation's high court, in a unanimous 7-page opinion, said it was unclear about certain key points of the Florida Supreme Court ruling at issue and sent the case back to the state high court for further proceedings.  
The Florida Supreme Court ruling, opposed by Bush and supported by Gore, extended the deadline for certifying the election results by 12 days until Nov 26 so hand-counted votes could be included in the final tally.  
Under the Florida Supreme Court ruling, Texas Gov Bush was certified the state's victor by 537 votes out of 6 million cast. Bush wanted reinstated the 930-vote lead over the vice president under the original Nov 14 deadline.  
Gore has contested the final results in cases now pending in Florida that are not directly affected by US Supreme Court ruling.  
Earlier, AP said: With the calendar closing in, the recent Vice President Al Gore believes would reverse Texas Gov George W. Bush's minuscule margin in Florida and send him to the White House instead of to a folksy but firm Tallahassee judge, with an appeal certain whatever his verdict.  
In the marbled splendour of the US Supreme Court, a decision is pending on Bush's appeal against the recount extension that delayed but did not stop his certification as the Florida winner by 537 votes, the fragment that would make him the 43rd president.  
Should that be the outcome, Gore said, and should it be Bush, not he, who is inaugurated on Jan 20, "he will be sworn in as my president, too."  
But that will be only "at the end of the day, when all processes have taken place," Gore said in an interview on CBS television's "60 Minutes" news magazine Sunday night.  
As that was broadcast, one of the processes was unfolding in closing arguments on the new recount case, to Leon County Circuit Judge N Sanders Sauls.  
"Whatever happens, both sides know this is going to end up in the Florida Supreme Court," Gore said. "It's not a recount. We want a first count."  
But it would be a recount, by hand, of ballots already tallied by machine in Miami-Dade and Palm Beach counties. That would cover about 14,000 disputed ballots.  
Republicans contend that Florida already has had a count and two recounts, and that the Bush win certified by the Republican secretary of state should stand. Katherine Harris announced that certification on Nov 26, the deadline set by the Florida Supreme Court when it ruled for Gore on an earlier appeal and extended the deadline to permit more time for recounting before the official figures were sent to the secretary of state.

## NCTB yet to take action against three printers

The National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB) has not yet taken any decision about three concerns of Beximco Group which failed to complete printing of 8.12 core textbooks within the stipulated time.  
Sources concerned said organisations representing the country's printing industry tried to draw attention of the NCTB in this regard and even wrote to the Prime Minister but no action has been taken so far.  
The NCTB had awarded the job of printing such a huge number of textbooks to only three Beximco concerns: Suktara, Free Press and Pustaka - which allegedly had no trade licence when those participated in the bidding, leaders of the Coordination Committee of Prokashana, Mudran and Bipinon Samity alleged at a press conference yesterday.  
Pustaka was awarded the job in violation of rules and regulation of the NCTB only on the ground that it had quoted the lowest price, they said.  
According to the terms and conditions of the tender document, Pustaka did not qualify for the bidding as it had quoted prices of only 20 books out of the 40, they alleged.  
On the other hand, members of the Prokashana, Mudran and Bipinon Samity quoted prices for all the 40 books, its leaders claimed.  
The Board is yet to take any fresh decision regarding those who have been given work order as it wants to ensure availability of books in time. NCTB Chairman Kapan Kanti Chowdhury told The Daily Star last night.  
Meanwhile, in a clarification, NCTB said the lowest bidder was awarded the job as the previous practice was not acceptable to the donors.  
The procedure was defective and against free competition," the clarification signed by a Member of the Board said.  
The government had approved printing of textbooks with its own resources through open tender for local printers in June this year.



### Delhi declines to accept Mamata's resignation

NEW DELHI, Dec 4: Indian Railway Minister and Trinamool Congress leader Mamata Banerjee today tendered her resignation owing moral responsibility for Saturday's train disaster in Punjab in which 43 people were killed and many others injured, reports BSS.  
However, Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee declined to accept the resignation of the railway minister and asked Ms. Banerjee to continue in her office, reports said quoting highly placed sources.

## Infiltration of separatists India to impose night curfew along border with Bangladesh

GUWAHATI, India, Dec 4: India will impose a night curfew along its international borders with Bhutan and Bangladesh to prevent infiltration by separatist guerrillas, a senior police official said today.  
The move to impose a night curfew on the international borders... would help security forces cut off the militants' transit routes," G.M. Srivastava of Assam's police told AFP.  
The step, which will be implemented "very soon," would also put a stop to the clandestine movement of rebels from bases in Bhutan into the northeastern state, Srivastava added.  
No date for the implementation of the curfew has been announced.  
The move came after militants in Assam went on a five-week killing spree, gunning down 75 people from the Hindi-speaking business community.  
The outlawed United Liberation Front of Asom (ULFA) and the National Democratic Front of Bodoland (NDFB), both fighting for independent homelands, have well entrenched bases in southern Bhutan.  
The rebels have been operating out of Bhutan over the past three years, staging hit-and-run guerrilla strikes in Assam. Indian officials estimate more than 4,000 armed rebels are operating from Bhutan.  
Leading army, police and paramilitary commanders, besides officials at the India's home ministry, met in Assam Sunday to review the state's law and order situation.

### At last Golam Azam says--

Azam, who is due to retire as Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami on Thursday, was addressing an Iftar party hosted by him in honour of politicians at Eskaton Ladies Club in the city yesterday.  
Leading the prayer, the collaborator of 1971 said the struggle against Rawalpindi was aimed at achieving freedom. But he did not say anything about his role during the war.  
Azam said the country is now "in the grip of Delhi and the present Awami League government is trying to make the nation a slave of India". He advised BNP Chairperson Khaleida Zia, who attended the Iftar, to intensify the current anti-government movement to free the nation from See page 11 col 1

## BNP's V-Day programme

## Pak political parties unite for end to military rule

ISLAMABAD, Dec 4: Pakistan's discredited and disgraced political parties formed a new opposition alliance demanding an immediate end to the military rule and restoration of democracy in this poor South Asian nation, according to newspaper reports today, reports AP.  
The Alliance for the Restoration of Democracy, represents 18 parties, including those of two ousted prime ministers, Benazir Bhutto and Nawaz Sharif one time arch-enemies.  
The other 16 parties range from ethnic and nationalist groups to small religious organizations, which have a history of sharp political and ideological differences.  
"We have put behind our differences for democracy," Nawabzada Nasrullah Khan, head of the new alliance told a news conference on Sunday. "Today our priority is to return the country to democracy."  
In Pakistan's rough and tumble politics one-time enemies become allies. Khan, for example, once led an alliance which worked to topple Sharif's government. Ms Bhutto was part of that alliance.  
In October 1999 the army threw out Sharif's government in a bloodless coup on charges of corruption and misuse. Gen Pervez Musharraf has promised elections before the end of 2002 in keeping with a Pakistan Supreme Court ruling.  
Before elections, Musharraf vowed to revive the economy, introduce electoral and economic reforms and clean up Pakistan's deeply corrupt political system.  
Local elections for district and municipal councils will begin later this month and will last for several months.  
Khan's new alliance warned the army government against making changes to the constitution and demanded an immediate transfer of power to a caretaker government of politicians who would oversee elections.  
His new alliance will lead peaceful demonstrations.  
"We will launch a peaceful, nonviolent campaign to press for our demands," he said, but did not elaborate.  
Most political parties, including many in the new alliance, had welcomed the military takeover, accusing Sharif of destroying institutions, undermining the constitution and runaway corruption.  
One year later they say the military government's anti-corruption drive is draconian and unjust.  
Sharif, who is currently in jail serving a life sentence on charges of hijacking and kidnapping, also faces several corruption charges.  
Sharif's Pakistan Muslim League is in disarray, with several top leaders demanding his removal as president. These leaders also have flatly refused to join any alliance in which Bhutto's party is represented.  
Bhutto, who divides her time between Britain and the United Arab Emirates, was convicted in absence of corruption and sentenced to five years in jail when Sharif was in power.  
Corruption is a major issue in Pakistan where four successive governments have been ousted on corruption since 1990.  
Frustrated by years of corruption and misuse by elected governments, most Pakistanis welcomed the army last year.

## Siltation: Piracy: Unrest Mongla port on verge of closure

KHULNA, Dec 4: Rising siltation, growing labour unrest, persistent piracy, rampant cargo pilferage and corruption in port administration have put the country's second largest Mongla port on the verge of closure.  
The river Passur has almost lost navigability due to siltation, forcing many ships to anchor in the deep sea and pushing cargo transportation cost higher.  
Frequent labour unrest has reduced its revenue earning and port activities have again been paralysed since last Friday as labourers and stevedores are locked in a discord which has seen loading and unloading in and from sea-going vessels at Mongla port come to a stop due to an indefinite strike. The discord is over appointment of additional labourers for unloading cement clinker from a ship.  
There is no sign of improvement in the uneasy situation created by a vested quarters, said a source at the Mongla Port Authority (MPA).  
The stevedores are determined not to bow down to pressure tactics employed by the workers and have termed the strike by the workers illegal. They have also stopped loading and unloading in and from ten sea-bound vessels from the day the workers went to strike.  
Efforts by the authorities to resolve the crisis have so far failed to produce any breakthrough, fuelling fear that Mongla port may be declared as an "Exclusion Zone" by the International Maritime Port Association if the deadlock continues, said a high official of the MPA.  
The observance of the 50th founding anniversary of Mongla Port on December 1 was a mere eyewash to shift attention from the fact the port is in deep trouble, said a leader of Dock Labour Management Board.

## 2 shot dead, 35 hurt in Moheshkhali gunfight

COX'S BAZAR, Dec 4: A fierce gunfight between in the two rival groups at village Khodarkum in Moheshkhali upazila left two people dead and 35 wounded today, reports UNB.  
The dead were identified as Abdur Sukkur, 45, and Jashim Uddin, 22, of Monazirpara of the island.  
Of the injured, Nurul Absar, 30, Sarwar, 15, Mahmudul, 20, Osman, 15, and Mukaddes, 17, were admitted to Sadar Hospital while others to Moheshkhali Health Complex.  
Hospital and local sources said there had been a dispute over 60 acres of coastal land at village Khodarkum between Bashir Member and Haji Idrish. The land was being used for shrimp cultivation in the rainy season and salt cultivation in the winter.  
Supporters of Bashir group of the village equipped with firearms were preparing for production at 10 am today. Suddenly the supporters of Haji Idrish launched an armed attack on them.  
Both groups exploded cock-tails, used machete and sawed-off rifles during the clash that continued for two hours.  
The feuding groups fired about 200 shots during the clash, local people said.
