However the SportAsia.com web site quoted sources as saving the Red Devils' tour will be in July and will also include matches against Malaysia and Tiger Cup champions Thailand. It will be Manchester United's first visit to Southeast Asia since a depleted side ap-

peared in 1995. United's last Asian foray was in July 1999 with matches in China and Hong Kong, but several stars including captain Roy Keane. David Beckham. Ronny Johnsen, Paul Scholes and Gary Neville, and was without manager Sir Alex Ferguson.

SportAsia said Ferguson would personally lead a full squad next year which will include Beckham.

Shearer to take his chances

LONDON, Dec 5: Newcastle skipper Alan Shearer is vowing to battle through the pain barrier to give manager Bobby Robson a huge fitness boost. reports AFP.

The 30-year-old striker missed his first game in the 15 months since Robson arrived at St James's Park on Saturday when he was forced to sit out the 1-1 English Prennership draw at Aston Villa with a bout of tendonitis, adding to the back and hamstring problems he has sustained in the last few

There were suggestions after the game that he could be out of action for up to a month, but Shearer has typically even refused to rule himself out of Saturday's daunting trip to Arsenal.

The former England captain is due to have a scan on the injury, but if he is given the slightest indication that he could play at Highbury, that will be all the encouragement he needs.

"I will be very disappointed if I am out for a month prieven three weeks," he said.

"In fact. I am very hopeful. and I am not even ruling myself out of Saturday's game at Highbury."

Robson had already expressed concern over the toll the current campaign was taking on Shearer when it became clear that the tendonitis in his knee, which required an injection during England's ill-fated Euro 2000 campaign, had flared up again.

"To tell the truth, I have been feeling the knee a bit lately and it has been getting worse," he said. "When I was shaping up to

shoot in training on Friday morning. I suffered this shooting pain. "I came straight off and I had

a fitness test on Saturday morning, but I soon realised it was no good.

An early return for Shearer would come as a huge boost to Robson, who has seen 7million pounds (10.5million dollars) summer signing Carl Cort sidelined until January after surgery on a hamstring tendon. with a hamstring problem also keeping Kevin Gallacher out.

Having won the French league and progressed to the Champions League semi-finals with Monaco, Scifo returned to his roots, and Anderlecht, with whom won four Belgian league titles, in 1997.

Vieira in more trouble

LONDON, Dec 5: French international Patrick Vieira · was charged with misconduct by the Football Association (FA) here Monday following Arsenal's stormy English Premiership clash with Leeds last month. reports AFP.

The FA's Video Advisory Panel (VAP) independently reviewed two incidents from the fixture, in which seven Gunners players - but not France 98 World Cup hero Vieira - were booked.

The panel quickly came to the conclusion to recommend charging Vieira, sent off six times during his Arsenal career. who could now face a threematch ban.

Vicira has already been suspended for a total of five matches this season after being

sent off twice in three matches. The VAP were called upon after referee Dermot Gallagher admitted he failed to spot the two separate incidents involving Leeds' Olivier Dacourt and Eirik Bakke.

The FA issued a statement which read: "Following the recommendations of the Video Advisory Panel, the Football Association today charged Arsenal's Patrick Vieira with mis-

"Three members of the VAP independently reviewed two incidents from the Premier League fixture between Leeds United and Arsenal at Elland Road on Sunday, 26 November. The referee has confirmed that he saw neither incident during the course of the game.

"Patrick Vieira has 14 days to respond to the charge." Norwegian midfielder Bakke has accused Vieira of being

malicious and stupid. "The head-butting was not the only thing Vieira did to me in that game. Bakke told Norwegian newspaper Dagbladet. 'He also elbowed me in the

face. I think he totally lost it in that match. That kind of behaviour in a football match is just stupid." Dacourt, however, has already said that Vieira, did not
