#### Two die in Pak Kashmir blast

MUZAFFARABAD, Pakistan, Dec 7: Two men were killed and 15 injured by an explosion yesterday at a busy market in the Pakistan-ruled part of Kashmir, reports Reuters.

Officials blamed neighbouring India for what they called a "ter-

rorist act". Police first reported one death in the blast in Muzaffarabad. capital of the Pakistan-controlled part of the disputed Himalayan region, but later said another injured man had died in hospital.

State Prime Minister Sultan Mahmood Chaudhry blamed India's Research and Analysis Wing (RAW) intelligence agency

for the explosion. The official APP news agency quoted him as saying RAW agents had set off a similar deadly blast in another town of the territory last year during the Muslim fast-

ing month of Ramadan. "After one year, it has repeated this act of terrorism which has exposed their real motives and nefarious designs," he said.

State Senior Minister Mohammad Ishaq Zafar also blamed India for what he called a "terrorist act".

He said the explosion near a fruit shop in Muzaffarabad town could have been caused by a bomb, although police said they

had not yet found any evidence. Pakistani officials often blame bomb blasts in their country on the intelligence agencies of archrival India, which in turn blames Pakistani agencies of similar acts

#### Blair to press India for release of convicted Briton

LONDON, Dec 7: British Prime Minister Tony Blair is to press India for the early release of convicted gun-runner Peter Bleach, a British newspaper reported today, citing diplomatic sources. reports AFP.

According to the Daily Telegraph, Blair may delay confirming his visit to India, provisionally scheduled for the New Year, in order to up the pressure on the Indian authorities over Bleach.

The 48-year-old Briton was arrested in December 1995, after he took part in an illegal arms drop over the Indian state of West Bengal.

He is serving a life sentence in a Calcutta jail and does not become eligible for release for at least 14

Sources cited by the Daily Telegraph said Britain was embarrassed that Russia had managed to secure the release of lour Russian nationals and one Latvian who were sentenced along with Bleach.

"We didn't look very strong," a diplomatic source was quoted as saying in the Telegraph.

The Russians managed to get all their people out, but our man was left on the inside. We weren't seen to be very successful at campaigning for justice on behalf of British citizens."

# Trial of Estrada begins as thousands stage rallies

MANILA, Dec 7: The Philippine Senate began its impeachment trial of President Joseph Estrada today, as tens of thousands of people marched outside demanding the former movie star's ouster even if he is

acquitted of corruption charges, reports AFP. Some 5,000 security personnel were deployed to keep the demonstrators away from the Senate building where the trial was held and

prevent the two sides from getting at each other. The anti-Estrada rallyists, including Vice-President Gloria Arroyo, former president Corazon Aquino and church leader Cardinal Jaime

Sin took turns lambasting Estrada and calling for his resignation. Nearly 50,000 anti-Estrada activists, businessmen, students, nuns and civic groups began congregating at a historic church near the

Senate, shortly after sunrise. "You have lost your moral ascendancy to govern us" Sin told the crowd, addressing Estrada.

After a mass, the anti-Estrada forces began a march with Arroyo and Aquino jointly bearing a "torch of truth" that would be carried in relays, Olympics-style, to the rally

Aquino and Arroyo walked about a hundred meters (yards) before passing the torch to representative of the business community. It was subsequently passed through the hands of other sectoral representatives as the march went around the Senate.

Estrada opponents were assigned to a site near a carnival where they set up a huge banner saying "Erap resign", referring to Estrada's popular nickname.

About 10,000 Estrada supporters also gathered at an empty lot near

the Senate, normally used for evangelical prayer rallies.

Their banner read: "Erap remain." They also waved banners saying "Erap for the poor" and "beloved senators, follow the masses" referring to Estrada's frequent boast that only the elite were against him and the country's poor continued to back him.

Estrada is accused of pocketing millions of dollars in bribes from illegal gambling rackets, embezzling tobacco taxes, shielding business cronies targeted by government regulators, and appointing relatives and friends to government posts.

He was impeached by the lower House of Representatives in November on the charges but under the Philippines' US-style political system, a two-thirds vote of the 22-member upper house, the Senate, is necessary to convict him. Security in and around the Senate building was tight with all people

entering the building being searched even if they held the proper identification cards. Senate sergeant at arms Leonardo Lopez said they would screen all

people entering thrice adding that they had bomb-sniffing dogs and bomb disposal teams at ready. Loudspeakers were set up outside the Senate building so that the

rallyists could listen to the proceedings inside. In a softening of the government's stance, Estrada's chief aide, Executive Secretary Ronaldo Zamora on Thursday said that government employees could take part in the rallies but would have to take leave or wait till after office hours.

## Suu Kyi awarded highest US honour

WASHINGTON. Dec 7: President Bill Clinton on Wednesday conferred America's highest civilian honour on confined Myanmar opposition leader Aung San Suu A Kyi, and pledged unending US support for her quest for democracy, reports AFP.

In a move sure to infuriate Myanmar's military rulers. Clinton awarded

the Presidential Medal of Freedom to Aung San Suu Kyi in absentia, warning the generals they would be outcasts until they ended tyranny and poverty in their "land of inherent promise."

"She sits confined, as we speak here, in her home in Rangoon, unable to speak to her people or the world. But her struggle continues and her spirit still inspires us," Clinton said.

No one had done more to teach that "the desire for liberty is universal," Clinton said, as he gave the medal to one of Aung San Suu Kvi's two sons. Alexander Aris.

Aung San Suu Kyi, 55, has been a high-profile irritant to Myanmar's military rulers for more than a decade, and has been back under house arrest in the capital, Yangon, for two months since her latest confrontation with the junta.

### US, S Korea fail to reach agreement

SEOUL, Dec 7: US and South Korean officials today failed to reach agreement over their inquiries into the alleged massacre of civilians by US troops 50 years ago, officials said, reports AFP.

South Korean negotiators, who had held a marathon overnight meeting here with US counterparts to work out a joint statement on the results of probes into the massacre, admitted no breakthrough had been made.

"We decided to have further talks to finalise it," said the head delegate Kim Byoung-Ho, from the Prime Minister's Office. No schedule for the next round

of talks was set, but Kim said both sides planned to wind up the case before US President Bill Clinton's tenure in the White House expires in January next year.

He did not elaborate further. but the dissent was reportedly over whether a premeditated order by the US military had been made to shoot Korean refugees.

Over the past year, Seoul and Washington have held their own separate investigations into the incidents at No Gun Ri, 214 kilometres south of Seoul, during the 1950-53 Korean War.

Over three days around July 26, 1950, American soldiers were alleged to have gunned down Korean civilians fleeing the North Korean army. The South's accounts have said hundreds were killed.

But a Pentagon probe into the wartime incident found no conclusive evidence soldiers were ordered to kill, suggesting instead their attack was sparked by panic, a US report said Wednesday.

#### Four killed in LTTE grenade attack

COLOMBO, Dec 7: Four people were killed in a suspected Tamil Tiger rebel attack today on a small village in eastern Sri Lanka, a military spokesman said, reports Reuters.

"About 20 people came and threw a grenade into a house. killing two men, one woman and a child," said military spokesman Brigadier Sanath Karunaratne.

He said the attackers were chased off into a jungle on the edge of the Sinhalese village, located near Welikanda, 200 km (125 miles) northeast of Colombo.

Police said they were still investigating the case, but added it was possible the attackers had mistaken their target for a nearby homeguard post.

#### Gunmen attack family of ULFA leader GUWAHATI, India, Dec 7;

Gunmen in the northeastern Indian state of Assam have attacked the family of the region's most powerful separatist rebel chief, police said today, reports



No one was injured in the attack, although Baruah's mother was home at the time. "A few bullets pierced through

the tin-roof of the house," a local police spokesman told AFP by telephone.

Baruah is believed to be in neighbouring Bhutan, where ULFA has its general headquar-

The attack on Baruah's house follows a spate of massacres of non-Assamese businessmen, which the government has blamed on ULFA. The rebel group has denied any involvement.

# 'Chances of Indo-Pak talks remote'

On December 2, Pakistan said its troops would exercise "maximum restraint" along the Line of Control (LoC) which divides Indian- and Pakistan-controlled Kashmir. Pakistan also said it was willing to enter into "meaningful dialogue" with India and proposed that the All Parties Hurriyat Conference (APHC), the main Kashmiri separatist alliance, hold talks with

Islamabad and New Delhi separately to pave the way for three-way talks. India on its part welcomed the offer of "maximum restraint" but rejected the demand for tripartite talks, although Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee indicated that the month-long ceasefire in Kashmir

Three prominent leaders of the Hurriyat are currently in New Delhi. reportedly for talks with the Indian leadership. Earlier this week, Hurriyat chairman Abdul Gani Bhat said he was ready for talks with both India and Pakistan and added that the ceasefire had generated a "propitious" atmosphere for talks to solve the Kashmir Issue.

Analysts, however, say short term prospects for any direct Indo-

Pakistan dialogue are bleak. "This is posturing, especially by Pakistan under international pressure," said Kalim Bahadur, a professor of South Asian Studies from New Delhi's Jawaharlal Nehru University.

'The positions taken by the two sides, are so rigid and inflexible that it is difficult to see them talking," he added. Brahma Chellaney, an analyst with the Centre for Policy Research. was equally pessimistic.

Chellaney said. "Peace does not work when you are under pressure militarily ... right now I think it is the militants who are in control, striking targets
