Gias Kamal suspended from BSS

Bangladesh Sangbad Sangstha (BSS) has suspended Gias Kamal Chowdhury, a journalist of the national news agency on charges of his audacious and derogatory remarks about the country's independence and sovereignty, the War of Liberation and the historic Language Movement of 1952, reports BSS.

The suspension order has been made effective from December 12. a notification of the BSS management said vesterday.

The management has served a show cause notice on Gias Kamal asking him to reply within next eight working days.

If he fails to reply, the notification said, the management may take unilateral action against

Bangabandhu Murder Case

Judgement on death reference today

The High Court will give its verdict on the death reference in the Bangabandhu murder case today.

A Death Reference Bench comprising Justice Ruhul Amin and Justice ABM Khairul Hug will deliver the judgement this morning after 63 days of hearing that ended on November 27.

The case has been recorded for verdict in the daily cause list of the High Court Division tomorrow", a court official said yesterday.

Dhaka District and Sessions Judge Kazi Golam Rasul in the verdict in the Bangabandhu murder case on November 8, 1998 ordered execution of 15 retired army officers by firing or hanging for killing Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman along with most of his family members on August 15, 1975.

Bush bound for White House

Gore expected to concede as SC rules out hand recount

WASHINGTON, Dec 13: Democratic White House hopeful Al Gore was expected to concede defeat to Republican George W Bush in a late Wednesday national address after calling off vote recount efforts in Florida, reports AFP.


"He will address the nation this evening," the vice president's campaign chairman, William

Daley, said in a terse statement that also indicated Gore had ordered aides in the decisive state to "suspend" what had been his best chance at wresting the White House from the Texas governor.

Daley's comments came after the US Supreme Court dealt what appeared to be a lethal blow to Gore's hopes by ruling against hand tallies of thousands of disputed ballots he said would wipe out Bush's narrow lead.

A senior Gore aide told AFP on condition of anonymity that "people in Florida are packing up to leave. We were told our work is done," but stopped just shy of saying outright that he would concede, saying dejectedly "it means what it means." The nine justices of the nation's highest court reversed a decision by

BB withdraws LC margin on import of raw materials

The Bangladesh Bank yesterday decided to withdraw the minimum letter of credit (LC) requirement for imports of industrial raw materials and components as a corrective measure.

In a circular issued yesterday, the central bank the Bank's corrective measure. said that the margin would be fixed based on the bank-client relationship. The measure "will come into force with immediate effect."

A previous Bangladesh Bank circular, issued Monday, set a margin for opening of LC with immediate effect for import of certain goods. Apparently, the decision was taken to ease pres-

sure on the foreign exchange reserve, which, at present, can barely meet two months' imports. Monday's circular fixed the LC margin for industrial goods at 30 per cent and 50 per cent for com-

mercial goods. The central bank decision had sparked off instant and intense criticism. Different chamber bodies as well as business associations said that the decision was imposed without any reason, explanation and consultation with anybody and demanded immedi-

tive impact on the economy. Meanwhile, a joint statement by the Metropolitan desh Bank on the issue of commercial imports," the Chamber of Commerce and Industry (MCCI), Dhaka statement said.

"This will benefit the economy," the statement said. "It (the decision) also shows the Bangladesh Bank's commitment to market orientation of the banking system. Its open-minded response to genuine requirements of the business is indeed apprecia-

The trade bodies, however, pointed out that the decision went only halfway towards correction as the 50 per cent margin requirement on LCs for commercial goods had been retained.

"We strongly urge the Bangladesh Bank to kindly reconsider the requirement as it will cause price increase of essential products," the statement said. It said that the issue should be left to the banks. The banks, the business organisations argued,

should fix the rate on the basis of their relationship with the clients and the items to be imported. 'We look forward to a positive response from the Bangla-

Dhaka-Shillong bus service discussed at Delhi talks

NEW DELHI, Dec 13: India and Bangladesh are considering introduction of a bus service between Shillong and Dhaka as part of their efforts to bolster bilateral cooperation in cross-border infrastructure

The subject of Dhaka-Shillong bus service came up for discussion

on the opening day of the two-day Foreign Secretary level talks between the two countries at the Hyderabad House here this morning. The two sides also agreed to expedite putting into operation, some-

times next month, but service between Dhaka and Agartala, meeting sources said here.

A memorandum of understanding is likely to be signed soon for Dhaka-Agartala bust service and inauguration of the service hinges on early completion of a 16-km stretch of road between the two countries. That stretch is now under repair.

The strengthening of road links between India and Bangladesh is as much part of their bilateral efforts as in the ambit of multilateral fora like SAARC and BIMS-TEC (Bangladesh, India, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Thailand Economic Cooperation), the sources said. See page 11 col 6

worried JS body urges govt

The Parliamentary Standing Committee on the Ministry of Science and Technology at a meeting yesterday expressed concern over the brain drain in the field of science and technology and asked the government to stop it.

'We are routinely deprived of the services of hundreds of scientists and scholars who leave every year to ensure maximum utilisation of their talents in their respective fields overseas," a ruling Awami League lawmaker was quoted as saying at the meeting.

Presided over by Committee Chairman Dr. H B M Iqbal, the meeting, which reviewed the projects taken up by the ministry, emphasized enactment of a law, if necessary, for maximum utilisation of local talents in the sector by stopping the brain drain.

The country's young and prospective scientists, particularly in the information technology (IT) sector need to be provided with incentives. the meeting observed. Proper opportunity and incentives to the local Rashid. Attorney General scholars can stop the brain drain, the meeting observed. Science and Technology Secretary Fazlur Rahman raised the issue

of brain drain while the committee members, including Science and Chhana and Rokanuddin Technology Minister Lt. Gen. (retd.) Nuruddin Khan took it up for an unscheduled discussion. Dr. Maisuzzaman of Bangladesh Council for Scientific Industrial Research (BCSIR) pointed out that most of the scientists leave the

> necessary supports to keep them in the country, "he said. 
