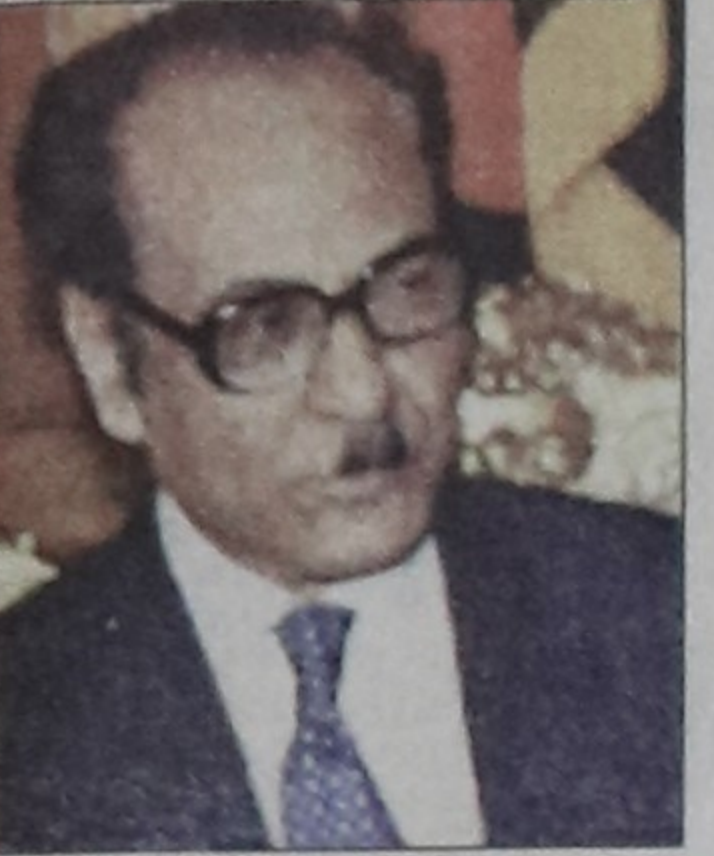

Comes again Victory Day

The nation celebrates today the 29th anniversary of its victory in the nine-month War of Independence in 1971.

The people will pay homage to three million martyrs who sacrificed their lives in the bloody war to liberate the motherland from Pakistani occupation forces. They would renew their pledge to materialise the martyrs' dream for a prosperous Bangladesh free from poverty, hunger, disease, illiteracy and all sorts of exploitation.

The Victory Day celebrations this year bear special significance following pronouncement of a historic judgement by the High Court in Bangabandhu murder case just two days back, confirming death sentences to 10 persons for killing the Father of the Nation and his family members in August 1975.

Besides, Pakistan's Deputy High Commissioner in Dhaka Irfan Raja was declared 'persona non grata' and asked to leave the country by last night for his audacious remarks on the War of Independence.

On December 16, 1971, the 93,000-strong Pakistani occupation forces surrendered to a Bangladesh-India joint command at Suhrawardy Uddyan in Dhaka, marking an end to the War.

The occupation forces had earlier indulged in an unprecedented massacre of the freedom-loving unarmed people of this country.

Today is a public holiday. The National Flag will be hoisted atop public and private buildings. The day will be heralded with a 31-gun salute at dawn.

President Shahabuddin Ahmed and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will lead the nation in paying tributes to the martyrs by placing floral wreaths at the National Memorial at Savar early in the morning.

The President, who is also supreme commander of the Armed Forces, will take salute of combined march past by Army, Navy, Air Force, BDR, Police, Ansar and other auxiliary forces at the National Parade Ground in the morning.

He will accord a reception, followed by iftar, at Bangabhaban. Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will attend the function. The Prime Minister will also visit Bangabandhu Museum and garland the portrait of See page 11 col 1

HC verdict "a great victory"

PM launches ruling party's election website

Bangladesh Awami League yesterday set up a new website www.al-election2001.net the first of its kind by any political party in the country, under the supervision of Election Steering Committee (ESC) of the party, reports BSS.

President of Awami League and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina formally launched the website at a simple ceremony in the afternoon at the party's Dhanmondi Election 2001 office.

Speaking on the occasion, the prime minister expressed the hope that by the grace of Almighty Allah the verdict of the Bangabandhu Murder Trial would be executed.

Referring to the split verdict delivered by a High Court Division Bench on the death reference in the Bangabandhu murder case, the prime minister said although the verdict did not fulfil the aspirations of the people in totality "we have achieved a great vic-

tory and come a long way in trying the heinous killers".

Finance Minister and ESC Chief Coordinator Shah A.M.S. Kibria, Secretary Muzaffar Hossain Paltu, Joint Secretary Advocate Syed Ahmed also spoke on the occasion.

Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad, Local Government Minister Zillur Rahman, members of the cabinet, senior party leaders, intellectuals and representatives of the front organisations attended the function.

Referring to the 50-year history of the party, the prime minister said Awami League was always installed in power by ballot and was never voted out from power. Rather, each time, it was unseated through conspiracies, killings and coups.

Split verdict spells AL worries

The latest developments in the trial of Bangabandhu Murder Case have become the prime concern for the Awami League government that is now on the verge of ending its term.

The High Court's split verdict on death sentences given by the trial court to 15 former army officers has brought about fresh concerns for Awami League that is mandated to continue in power for less than seven months from now. Because, the party has a plan to quit power earlier than scheduled, taking into consideration some key factors suitable for it to contest the next general election.

Its secret plan have it that the government will transfer power to the caretaker administration at a suitable time after celebrating the next Independ-

ence Day on March 26 in a befitting manner. And, the government expects execution of the verdict in the Bangabandhu Murder Case before the hand-over of power. The AL believes that punishment to Bangabandhu's killers, a key agenda of the ruling party, before it transfers power will give it a lot of dividends in the next elections.

Nevertheless, the latest developments in the process of trial have upset the AL plan. The party is learnt to be examining its plan afresh and consulting legal experts to understand how long the trial may take to culminate in the execution of the verdict.

Irfan Raja expelled

Errant Pak diplomat flies out

Bangladesh yesterday expelled errant Pakistani diplomat Irfan Raja on a 12-hour notice for his audacious and derogatory remarks on the War of Independence.

The government decided to bundle out Pakistan's Deputy High Commissioner in Dhaka by declaring him persona non grata under Article 9 of the Vienna Convention.

Raja left Dhaka at 10:30 pm on a Biman flight to Dubai.

This is for the first time that Bangladesh has invoked this provision of the Vienna Convention and expelled a diplomat.

Islamabad terms it "unjustified"

ISLAMABAD, Dec 15: Pakistan on Friday said it was surprised that its deputy high commissioner had been ordered to leave Bangladesh, saying the decision was "unjustified" and not in keeping with friendly relations, reports AFP.

Dhaka earlier declared Pakistani diplomat Irfan Raja persona non-grata following nation-wide protests against controversial remarks he made almost three weeks ago about Bangladesh's War of Liberation in 1971.

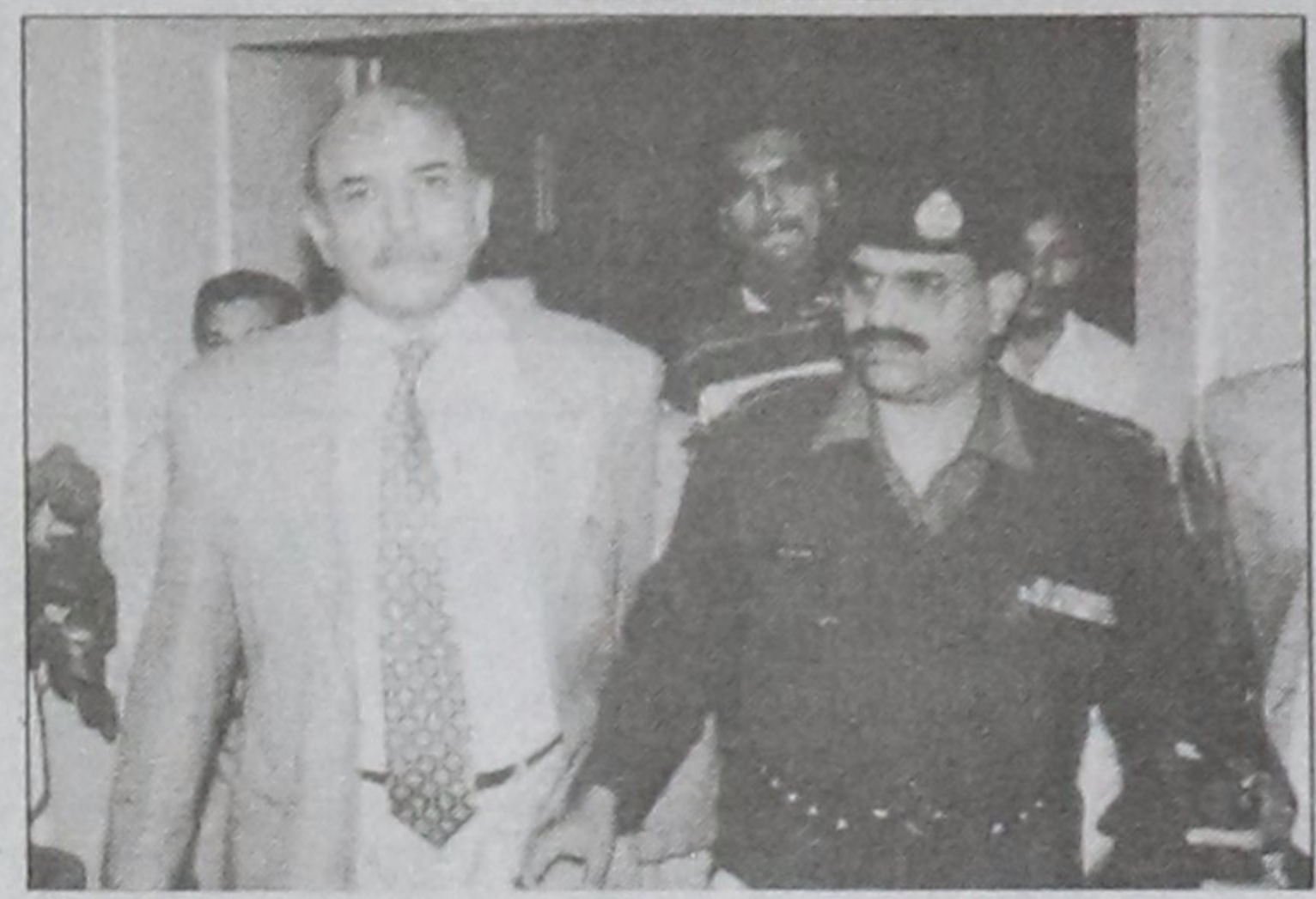
"This decision... is not keeping with the spirit of friendly relations between the two countries," a See page 11 col 2

High Commissioner Iqbal Ahmed Khan, summoned to the Foreign Ministry at 11 am yesterday. Acting Foreign Secretary Dr Toufik Ali conveyed the decision that Raja must leave the country within December 15.

The High Commissioner was reminded that a strong protest was made immediately after Irfan Raja made the remarks at a seminar in Dhaka on November 27. "The remarks were incompatible with his status as a diplomat," a spokesman of the foreign ministry said.

He noted that the government had to take the stern action as the diplomat did not leave Dhaka See page 11 col 1

Food autarky, availability not same, says Amartya

Pratichi (Bangladesh) Trust launched

Nobel Laureate Professor Amartya Sen has said achieving autarky in food production will not automatically solve the food crisis of the commonman unless other necessary measures are taken.

"Self-sufficiency in food production and availability of food for people is not the same thing," Prof Sen said while launching the Pratichi (Bangladesh) Trust in the city yesterday.

The Trust has been set up with one lakh dollars from Prof Sen's Nobel Award to help the poor, especially the women. A similar trust has started work in India.

The Bengalee Nobel Laureate made this observation when asked what Bangladesh should now do to end food crisis as it has almost achieved food autarky.

He said, India is not dependent on outside sources for food for the last few years, but malnourishment is a major problem for its population.

In his nearly one-hour speech, Prof Sen emphasised women education to reduce child mortality rate and women fertility rate and to give them

more access to decision-making bodies at all levels. "Anything that increases the decision-making power of women has a positive impact on decline of fertility rate," he said.

Prof Sen praised Bangladesh's efforts to reduce child mortality and women fertility rates and said the trend is one of the fastest in this region.

BRAC Chief Fazle Hasan Abed and Executive Director of Centre for Policy Dialogue, Dr Debapriya Bhattacharya, also spoke on the occasion.

Earlier on the day, Prof Sen handed over the document of the Pratichi Trust, at a simple function held at the BRAC centre in the city.

The Trust will focus on gender empowerment and education and health of the backward sections of the people. The Trustee Board has four other members. They are Prof Rehman-Sobhan, Dr Kamal Hossain, Dr Meghna Guha Thakurta and Sultana Kamal, daughter of late poet Sufia Kamal. Prof Sobhan will work as Managing Trustee.

The trustees will soon devise plans for the Trust. See page 11 col 4

Greek FM due Dec 20

Foreign Minister of Greece George A. Papandreu arrives in Dhaka on December 20 on a day's official visit to Bangladesh, it was learnt yesterday.

He will lead a 54-member delegation comprising senior officials and businessmen.

This will be the first high-level contact between the two countries since Bangladesh's independence.

Greece, a shipping giant, is an important member of the European Union and the NATO.

A large number of Bangladeshis, both documented and undocumented, are working in Greece.

The visiting foreign minister is expected to pay a courtesy call on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and hold official talks with Bangladesh Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad.

D-8 Commission meets in capital next month

Test flight of plane, Islamic banking to top agenda

Dhaka will host a two-day meeting of the D-8 Commission next month which is expected to lay the ground for the D-8 Summit due to take place in Cairo early next year.

Test flight plan for a D-8 manufactured aircraft, unfolding a scheme for Islamic banking and progress in easing trade and visa restrictions among the eight member-countries are likely to dominate discussions at the Dhaka meet, sources said.

Senior officials of all the member-countries will attend the meeting, scheduled for January 16 and 17.

Bangladesh is the current chairman of the D-8 or the Developing Eight. Egypt, Iran, Indonesia, Malaysia, Nigeria, Pakistan and Turkey are the other members of the economic forum.

The Dhaka meeting will review progress of the organisation since its second Summit here on March 1 and 2 last year.

It is learnt that some major progress made in the domain of D-8 co-operation in the last one and a half years include complete See page 11 col 4
