Bangladesh has proposed to run two additional Biman flights to New Delhi to fill the gap caused by postponment of British Airways flights which used to connect the two capitals, reports

At a press briefing in the city yesterday, Foreign Secretary CM Shafi Sami said the Indians have positively responded to Dhaka's proposal.

The foreign secretary was in New Delhi last week to lead the Bangladesh team to the bilateral consultation meeting.

At present, Bangladesh Biman has two weekly flights which touch New Delhi while bound for the West. The proposed flights are limited to Dhaka and New Delhi only, the Foreign Secretary added.

Before postponing its service, the British Airways used to connect New Delhi with Dhaka five times a week.

JU female teacher alleges harassment

ficking. Accordingly, the network urged the SAARC foreign ministers in December 1996 to take action against trafficking and formulate common position among people's organisation.

The participants also demanded formation of a regional court to try those found guilty of trafficking and finalise the 'Draft Convention to Combat Trafficking.

The main slogan of the SAARC Peoples' Forum is 'Security of Livelihood, Security of Movement and the theme is Trafficking in Persons, Migration and Strategles for Food Sovereignty and Crisis in Livelihood'.
