

## New chief of Bank Indonesia nominated

JAKARATA, Nov 19: President Abdurrahman Wahid moved quickly to curtail uncertainty about Indonesia's troubled economy late Saturday by nominating a new head for its central bank less than 24 hours after most of its board quit. reports AP.

Wahid called on the Parliament to appoint Anwar Nasution, who had just resigned as acting chief of Bank Indonesia - the country's central lender. said senior economics minister Rizal Ramli.

Though Wahid has been accused of meddling in the affairs of bank. The Jakarta Post newspaper on Sunday quoted parliamentary speakers Akbar Tandjung as saying that Nasution was the best candidate for the job.

"It is a fact that Anwar (Nasution) is the best of all," he said. "We would prefer him to sit in the BI (Bank Indonesia) driving seat. Tandjung said Nasution had

The euro slid to fresh two-week lows against dollar on Friday, as the latest wrangling over manually counted ballots in the still unresolved US presidential election further delayed the final results. But it found little consolation in thin late US trading, having fallen to 84.77 cents, its lowest level since Nov. 1. Europe's single currency closed at 84.83 cents, down from Thursday's US close. The euro's late-day declines and negative tone raised concerns that the European Central Bank might be forced to intervene to support the currency on Monday. The ECB intervened three times during the past two weeks.

Dollar also gained ground against Swiss France, climbing to fresh two-week peaks above 1.8000 francs. Yen, meanwhile, firmed slightly against dollar after sinking sharply earlier this week amid Japan's political crisis. Dollar closed at 108.84 yen, down slightly on the day but within sight


