The explosion at a house at Mir Hazirbagh in the city yesterday might have taken place due to accumulation of gas in the underground water reservoir.

When asked, a gas expert of Petrobangla said 'natural marsh gas' and Methane may accumulate in underground water reservoir. Such gas may also come from sewerage lines nearby.

According to witnesses, there were several gas stoves in one place near the water reservoir. This could be another reason for accumulation of gas in the reservoir, the expert said.

"The whole city is full of illegal gas connection lines and we are always running the risk of such explosions," he said.

Because the authorities no longer mix any odor with the gas supplied to houses, if gas leak

Blast in underground
water tank kills 4

At least four persons including three of a family were killed and 10 others injured in a massive explosion inside an underground water reservoir at a house at Mirhajirbagh near Jatrabari crossing in the city yesterday.

The dead included two children and the injured included five children.

Two rooms and a kitchen of the tin shed house turned into debris.

The explosion occurred with a big bang as about 12:30 pm as soon as Ishrat Ali, a tenant at a nearby room, got inside the reservoir in the kitchen with a burning candle to clean it.

Police and hospital sources identified the dead as Rupa, 2, daughter of Ruhul Amin, 12, his father Ishrat Ali, 40 and Dildarul Alam, 20. Ali was the grandfather of Rupa.


The bodies were sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) for autopsy.

Of the injured, five were admitted to DMCH. They are Runa, 5, the elder sister of Rupa, Akbar, 7, Rubel, 10, Maksuda, 13, and Sonia, 13. Most of the dead and injured bore marks of burn injury in different parts of their bodies.

Neighbours and local people recovered two bodies soon after the horrific incident. Fire Service and Civil Defense personnel rescued two other bodies from under the debris later.

Twenty-nine tenant families reside in a cluster of 29 ten-shed rooms in the compound.

Major General M Harun-ar-Rashid, Bir Pratik, will start discharging his responsibilities as the new Chief of Army Staff today.

He will be promoted to the rank of Lieutenant General today.

The new army chief will be adorned with the badges of Lt General at a ceremony at the Ganabhaban, by Chief of Naval Staff Rear Admiral A Taher and Chief of Air Staff Air Vice Marshal Jamal Uddin in the presence of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at 11:20 am.

Yesterday was the last day of Lt Gen Mustafizur Rahman, Bir Bikram, as Chief of Army Staff. At a simple ceremony at the Army Headquarters in the afternoon, he handed over command of the Bangladesh Army to Maj Gen Harun-ar-Rashid.

Earlier yesterday morning, Mustafiz was promoted to the rank of General. He was adorned with the badges of a General in presence of the Prime Minister, who also holds charge of the Defence Ministry, at a ceremony at the Ganabhaban.

10 transferred to absorb
political appointees?

Resentment among JS Sectt officials

The Jatiya Sangsad Secretariat has transferred 10 of its officials who were on deputation from various ministries.

They have been transferred to pave the way for absorbing political appointees in the Sangsad secretariat, one of the officials said.

The transfer orders issued about a week ago have caused resentment also among the other officials on deputation at the Sangsad Secretariat, sources said.

In separate letters, the ministries concerned have been requested to take back the 10 officials who were working at the Sangsad secretariat for long.

The officials are: Deputy Director (Public Relations) Azizur Rahman, Assistant Secretary (Delegation) Mahbuba Farzana, Senior Assistant Secretary (Law) Abdul Hal, Training Specialist Nikhil Ranjan Roy, Senior Legislation Draftsman Mahbub Moshred, Estate Officer Shohail Motahar, Assistant Secretary Naseeb Saitullah, Assistant Director (Public Relations) Mohammad Rezaul Haq, Training Specialist Sadia Khanam and Law Officer Mohammad Harunar Rashid.

The ministries have now asked the officials to join their respective posts by January 1. However three

of them have been 'exempted' as they personally contacted the authorities concerned, sources said.

It is alleged that the Sangsad Secretariat 'absorbed' more than 10 officials including two political appointees in the last couple of years, as desired by the Speaker.

Sangsad officials noted that appointment of Class-I and Class-II officers should be made on the basis of selection by the Public Service Commission. But the Sangsad Secretariat sometimes did not follow rules and regulations in 'appointing and absorbing' officials, they alleged.

Two Assistant Personal Secretaries (APSs) to the Speaker Sirajul Islam Badsha and Samia Islam who are political appointees were 'absorbed' as regular staff of the Sangsad Secretariat in October this year. Two others were then appointed in those posts, they said.

One source said the Office of the Accountant General (AG) has objected to absorption of the two political appointees in the Sangsad Secretariat and suspended payment of their salaries.

Speaker Humayun Rashed Chowdhury was not available for his comments on the issue.

Ministry's 'no' to BB plea
for wage hike in NCBs

The Finance Ministry has rejected a proposal to increase wages and allowances of the staff of nationalised commercial banks (NCBs).

Bangladesh Bank Governor Dr M Farashuddin recently proposed that wages in the NCBs be raised to give incentive for better work.

However, Finance Minister SAMS Kibria in a letter to the governor has said, there is a 'logic to raise wages and allowances of employees of the NCBs. But at the same time, we have to keep in mind our ability. On top of it, if we consider the low level of performance and financial insolvency of the nationalised commercial banks, then the existing facilities may not look that insignificant.'

The demand for a separate wage structure for the banking sector had been voiced for a long

time and many thought it might give the needed incentive to perform better.

A kingpin of smuggling ring
from Ctg involved

250 boxes of smuggled goods dropped in Bay, police told

CHITTAGONG, Dec 23: A kingpin of a smuggling ring who hails from the southern part of Chittagong and owns industries and palatial hotel and is a director of private bank, is reportedly involved in bringing the consignment of smuggled goods which were eventually dropped into the Bay of Bengal, sources said.

Police also received reports about involvement of the kingpin who made a fortune by indulging in smuggling of gold, heroin and other contrabands.

They said they are after more clues but declined to go into details.

A senior police official told The Daily Star that the Joint Interrogation Cell came to know from confessional statements of the Pakistani national and other

He said that hunt was on for two other Pakistani nationals who stayed with the arrested Pakistani national, Mohammad, at Hotel Saint Martin in Agrabad area using a local address of Imam Textile Mills, which is owned by an industrialist of Chittagong, police and hotel sources said.

Police said they would go to the hotel tomorrow to check it out and get more clues. However, sources suspected that the boxes were loaded with gold, not arms.

Police also said another Bangladeshi crew was produced before the court today to record his confessional statement.

Meanwhile, Navy continued search in the Bay for the mysterious boxes, sources said.
