SYDNEY. Jan 1: Waugh's ruthless approach milestone in the fifth Test in Sydney and sink the West In-

dies further into turmoil, re-Waugh's Australian team is targeting its 15" consecutive Test win and a first ever whitewash of the West Indies when the series finale gets underway Tuesday at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

With a 4-0 lead in the five Test series, the Australians are hot favourites to achieve both goals against the embattled tourists.

Waugh has guided the Australians to 13 of their world record 14 successive wins on this sequence and, with 15 wins from 20 Tests to date as skipper, he is the most successful captain in international cricket.

Extending Australia's winning stretch and completing the first sweep of a comparable series since their 5-0 whitewash of South Africa in 1931-32. will only enhance Waugh's reputation as Australia's greatest skipper.


