



centred relationships. It is the way Bradshaw handles the entire menagerie of emotions and situations with a calculated understated scalpel makes me fly through its pages without pauses. But Lucky Baby Jesus is also a novel about sex, repressed sex, closeted sex, and the insatiable hunger for more sex the way sex is intellectualised for the purposes of feigned discussion or sometimes even for the negation of so-called guilt.


The novel's content, style, panache, and brio, does not surprise me at all, given Peter Bradshaw's history as a Cambridge graduate and a successful London writer. My lack of surprise is even more so, having read and enjoyed many of the fine pieces he has written for the Modern Review, New Statesman, Tribune, Punch, and London Review of Books. He has also written and performed the BBC Radio Four programme 'For One Horrible Ioment', and is currently the film critic for The Guardian.

Ultimately the novel's success PEPER BRADSHAW






