ERD Secretary Dr Maslur Rahman and Australian High Commissioner Robert Flavin signed the SA on behalf of their respective sides.


Don't make eviction from footpath a political issue, says Nasim

The Prime Minister said catering to the need of the time, her government has been exploring all avenues to develop this very vital sector of the present day world.

In this connection she said only in the last week a 15-member Task Force headed by herself was constituted to harness the economic, social and commercial potentialities of IT sector.

She said the task force, focal point of which is to be located directly at the Prime Minister's office, would identify the areas of economic and commercial potentialities of this sector. It would also frame guidelines for expansion, development and flourish of this key-sector of modern world.

The task force would also fix up target, time-frame and other

necessary guidelines to harness the export possibilities of computer software and IT-enabled services, she added.

The prime minister said in order to make the best utilisation of tremendous scopes created before us to tap the IT sector prospects, we had to change our outlook befitting the global situation.

"We have lost enough time and have no scope make any further delay," she said while expressing her dismay over the negligence of the past governments in utilising the scopes came before them in developing this sector.

The prime minister said apart from development of IT sector, steps have also been taken to modernise other related sectors like telecommunications, power generation and amendment of related laws like Intellectual Property Rights and Electronic Authentication and Network Security.

She said, "We have brought 34 districts under digital telecommunications network. We also have a plan to bring all other districts under digital services." Besides, for the first phase we have earmarked 90 upazilas to bring under digital phone system, she added.

The delegation members put forward a number of suggestions for the development of IT sector in Bangladesh. They assured the prime minister that they would dedicate their services and potential experiences, they gathered abroad for the promotion of this sector in their motherland.

The prime minister urged them to submit their proposals and suggestions and assured the best help and cooperation from her government to assist them in their noble initiatives.




