### India revert to first schedule

NEW DELHI, Jan 9: Australia's keenly-awaited cricket tour of India will go ahead as scheduled next month after the hosts agreed to revert to the original itinerary, sources said on Tuesday, reports AFP.

The Australians were upset that India wanted to cancel a three-day match so that the tour did not clash with the Sharjah tri-series between India. Pakistan and Sri Lanka

from April 4. Sharjah organisers have now agreed to postpone the triseries by four days, paving the way for the Australians to complete the Indian tour by the

originally agreed date of April 6. "We have agreed to India's request to postone our event," said Zahid Noorani, chief executive of the Sharjah-based

Cricketers Benefit Fund Series. The Sharjah tri-series will now be played from April 8 to

Javawant Lele, secretary of the Board of Control for Cricket in India, said the Australian tour programme will be formally unveiled in New Delhi on

January 22. But sources indicated the tourists, who arrive on February 14, will play two three-day matches at Baroda (February 17-19) and Bombay (February 22-24) before the first Test starts in Bombay on February

Another three-day match at New Delhi from March 6-8 will be followed by back-to-back Tests at Madras (March 11-15) and Calcutta (March 18-22).

There will also be five one-


day internationals at various venues across India before the tour ends on April 6. Lele made light of the Aus-

Australian captain Steve Waugh considers the Indian tour the last unconquered frontier for his world-beating team.



#### Malik thrown out of cricket

KARACHI, Jan 9: Former Pakistani captain Salim Malik banned last year from international cricket, was also effectively outsted from the domestic arena Monday after being dropped from his employers squad, reports AFP.

"We have not included his name in the squad of 25 for a premier first class event as per Pakistan Cricket Board's directive," Abdur Raquib, in charge of sport at Habib Bank, told

Pakistan's premier tournament for private organisations starts from January 26. Malik was banned for life in

May last year after an inquiry conducted by Justice Malik Mohammad Qavyum found him guilty of match fixing.

He became the first former national cricket captain to sulfer a life ban. A similar fate befell South Africa's Hansie Cronje and Indian Mohammad Azharuddin afterwards.

The Habib Bank team includes Akram Raza, who was fined in Qayvum's report. But Raquib defended Raza's

inclusion saying Raza was fined for not cooperating with the inquiry and there is no ban imposed on him."

Meanwhile a Lahore court, which is hearing Malik's appeal against the life ban, adjourned the case until January 28.

"We are fighting against the life ban and are hopeful to win the appeal against the life ban." Malik's-lawyer, Malik Shahid Hamid, told this news agency. "My client is losing some precious cricket time," he said.

## Cronje challenges ban

Cronje is seeking a court order to review a life ban, claiming it unlawfully prevents him from promoting and coaching cricket among undeprivileged children, according to press reports Tuesday, says

In papers filed at the Pretoria High Court against the United Cricket Board of South Africa (UCBSA) which imposed the ban. Cronje says he does not dispute the termination of his contract or the playing ban. and does not intend to resume a professional playing career. The Citizen daily reported.

Cronje however stresses that the UCBSA has no legal powers to regulate his participation in matters connected to cricket beyond his playing career, and believes that he should be allowed to make amends for his conduct. the Johannesburg-

Cronje said. In his application. Cronje also accuses the UCBSA of being motivated by a deep and abiding personal antipathy toward him, and of trying to damage his future employment prospects in an utterly unreasonable and purely vindictive

manner. The UCBSA announced its intention in October to ban Cronje from all aspects of game after firing him in April when he admitted to having taken money from bookmakers.

The UCBSA has said it would defend the ban in court against the application to have it overturned. No date has been set yet for a hearing.
