Harper began his career three years back and already officiated in ten Test matches and 41 ODIs. The 49-year-old umpire from Adelaide will fly back home on January 31 and submit a report to the ICC thereafter. During his 17-day, he will

officiate in some National League matches and may also conduct academic sessions for local umpires.


Most of the ten umpires. who have been recommended by West Indian umpire Steve Bucknor in November, would accompany Harper in these matches, said Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) general secretary Syed Ashraful Huq vesterday.

Harper begins his mission with a four-day match of the Green Delta National League between Bangladesh Biman and Dhaka Metropolis at the BKSP on January 17. He will make his Bangabandhu National Stadium debut with the commencement of last round match of the National League between Chittagong and Dhaka Metropolis on January 27.

Harper might also put on his uniform in one or two exhibition matches of visiting Commonwealth Bank Cricket Acadcurv at the BNS, revealed Ashraful.


