A tense situation was prevailing in the city's Kalyanpur area yesterday following Sunday's clashes between police and local people who were protesting the killing of two persons, including a Jubo Dal eader.

Faruk, a local terrorist and his gang allegedly shot dead Jubo Dal leader Abul Kashem, 35, and his accomplice Rezaul Karim, 38, inside a club at Kalyanpur on Saturday night.

The trouble began Sunday morning when a large number of local people brought out a procession and tried to hold a rally putting up a barricade on Mirpur Road.

According to sources, Kashem, president of Jubo Dal ward No 11 unit and also a contractor of PWD, was a probable candidate for the post of ward commissioner.

Police have, so far, arrested three people, including Faruk for their alleged involvement in the double murder. They were produced before the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court yesterday

Additional police have been deployed in Kalyanpur area to avoid further incident.



**Disaster on the river Meghna**

The parliamentary standing committee on the Ministry of Shipping has asked authorities concerned to mete out exemplary punishment to people responsible for the disaster on the river Meghna on December 29 last year that claimed nearly 200 lives.

In the early hours of December 29, Shariatpur-bound passenger vessel ML Baihonsi with some 300 passengers on board was hit by MV Jalkapot-2 at Ekhlashpur in Motlab Upazila, some 30 kilometres off the Chandpur river port.

Both the two committees, formed to identify reasons behind the tragic accident and assess damages, held Ialkapot-2 responsible in their preliminary reports.

At its meeting yesterday, the standing committee asked the Shipping Directorate to submit its probe report on causes of riverine accidents, meeting sources said. The directorate has formed its own

**British scientists** 

develop leukaemia

LONDON, Jan 15: British scien-

tists on Monday announced the discovery of a treatment that can seek and destroy leukaemia cells and which could lead to a new way of treating cancer, reports AFP.

Researchers at the Hammersmith Hospital and Imperial College School of Medicine in London have spent six years investigating the disease.

Their work identified a gene, labelled WT-1, which is present in cells that cause leukaemia. Tracing the gene allowed the researchers to identify the cells responsible for the disease.

The discovery, detailed in the publication Hammersmith Research, has led scientists to use the principle in developing immune cells that can recognise a WT-1 "label" on cancer cells and destroy them.

Results have shown the specially engineered immune cells will destroy leukaemia cells and ignore normal cells of the same type.

Clinical trials among leukaemia patients will now be carried out

within two years Hans Stauss, of Imperial College, said: "The principle we have developed can be applied to almost all forms of leukaemia and could signal a huge step forward in how we treat

the disease. "What makes this work even more exciting is that our findings can also be applied to solid cancers, such as breast or lung cancer, where there is similar over-expression of WT-1.

"The possibilities for new treatments are enormous.

David Grant, scientific director for the Leukaemia Research Fund. which helped pay for the research, said: "This could well be the chink in the armour cancer doctors have been looking for.

"We look forward to the results of this trial and introducing a whole new range of therapies to patients." Around 18,000 people are diagnosed with leukaemia or one of the related cancers of the blood in Britain every year.

Official sources said some 10,000 former students who obtained degrees from various departments and institutes of the university would receive certificates in the convocation.


