Writs against **PSA** case likely today **By Special Correspon**dent

A writ petition challenging filing of a case under Public Safety Act (PSA) against BNP lawmaker Manzoor Morshed Khan is likely to be filed with the High Court by his lawyers today.

Sources close to the lawyers said Barrister Syed Ishtiaque Ahmed will move the court on behalf of Khan who, along with 16 lawyers, has been implicated in a case filed under PSA for alleged vandalism at the Supreme Court on Thursday. The case was filed on Monday by

a pro-government lawyer. Barrister Ishtiaque will certify that Khan was in the court on Thursday for the hearing on his writ challenging the constitutional validity of the PSA.

A case was filed under PSA against Morshed Khan in Chittagong for ransacking a sweetmeat shop and looting Tk 45,000 from the cash box on December 26. Another writ on behalf of the 16 See page 11 col 8

10 killed in rebel attack on Srinagar airport

SRINAGAR, India: Hurling grenades and firing guns, a militant suicide quad engaged in a 45-minute battle outside the gates of Srinagar Airport today, leaving 10 people dead and eight wounded, reports AP.

Lashkar-e-Tayyaba, one of the guerilla groups fighting to separate the Himalayan region of Jammu-Kashmir from India, claimed responsibility for the attack. The group gave the names of six men it said had died in the attack

That was confirmed by the police and a count of the bodies in a police station near the airport. They were clad in police uniforms with grenades attached

Two civilians a 16-year-old girl and a bank manager were killed. Their relatives cried over the bullet-riddled bodies in the police station.

Police in the state capital in Jammu confirmed two Central Reserve Police Force officers were killed but an officer at the scene said three constables had been killed, which would bring the death toll to 11. Four woman constables were among the eight people injured.

The militants tossed grenades and fired their guns when they were stopped at the first of many security checkpoints on the main road to the airport, police told The Associated Press in Jammu, the winter capital of the state

Abu Osama, a spokesman for the Lashkar-e-Tayyaba militant group, called news agencies to claim responsibility for the attack, saying it was carried out by a suicide squad that had made an attempt on the airport last

KHULNA, Jan 14: CID investigation into the sensational Rob murder case is being questioned by different quarters as the 'godfathers and killers' have so far escaped interrogation.

The complainant, Arifur Rahman Mithu, alleged that Investigation Officer (IO) ASP Khashrul Huq and a top official of CID, influenced by some local leaders of ruling Awami League, are buying time to damage the merit of the case.

The fate of the case has become uncertain, he alleged.

The compliment is the eldest son of SMA Rob, the ruling party's mayoral candidate who was murdered on August 11 last year. Thirteen people were named in the FIR as accused.

Rob's aide Rangulal was arrested before the FIR was lodged. Acting on his statement, police arrested two PBCP outlaws -- Bitu and Moyeen -and recovered a sawn-off rifle and a home-made gun from their possession. The two confessed that the arms were used in the murder.

In his judicial confession recorded under Section 164, Rangulal had also said that five others -- Shanu. Choton, Shumon, Babul and Kamrul

-- were among the gang of killers and that Jubo League activists Mota Selim, Bappi and Bipul carried the arms used in the murder.

The case was handed over to CID in September last year despite serious objection by the complainant and Rob's wife. The compliment

expressed 'no-confidence' in CID investigation. Bitu and Moyeen were interrogated by a joint interrogation call (JIC) in Dhaka during their 12-day

remand They were brought back to Khulna District Jail when they refused to give any further statement under Section 164 in the CMM's court, Dhaka.

Another PBCP member-- Rafiqul Islam Hitler -- was arrested in November from West Baniakhamar under Khulan Sadar thana. The IO interrogated Hitler for one week and recorded his statement under Section 164.

Close associate of Mufti Hannan held in Khulna

KHULNA, Jan 16: Khulna thana police arrested one Yunus Chowdhury, 38, on Monday afternoon suspecting him to be a close associate of Mufti Abdul Hannan wanted in the Kotalipara bomb planting case.

Yunus Chowdhury hails from Chapail village under Narhagati thana of Narail district. He was arrested on the basis of a petition written to the highest authority of police by one Mujibar Rahman Molla of the same village.

Molla in his petition has stated that Yunus Chowdhury is one of the close associates of Mufti Abdul Hannan. mastermind of a conspiracy to kill Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina by planting a high-powered bomb near the venue of her public meeting at Kotalipara last year.

Mufti Hannan, main accused in the bomb planting case, used to visit the village home of Jamaat leader Abdus Salam Chowdhury, elder brother of Yunus Chowdhury frequently in 1996.

Mufti Hannan, Salam Chowdhury and Yunus Chowdhury jointly established a soap factory on the other side of Chapail ferry ghat named as 'Tintara Madhumati Soap Factory.'
