5 lawyers to meet PM. talk SC crisis

Five senior lawyers will meet Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in the last week of this month in a bid to resolve the crisis over appointment of two judges in the Appellate Division of Supreme Court, sources said. The prime minister expressed

willingness to meet the lawyers through message from the law minister's office to Barrister Ishtiaque Ahmed's chamber. The five senior jurists had been trying to get an appointment with the PM since last week

Hasina regretted that she couldn't meet them earlier due to the conference and the general assembly of the Association of Asian Parliaments for Peace, scheduled to be held in Cambodia from January 22 to 26

She leaves the capital for Cambodia tomorrow (Saturday).

Sources said that she was unable to give the lawyers any appointment before her visit. Law Minister Abdul Matin Khasru would also participate in the conference

On January 11, pro-opposition lawyers lodged strong protest when the government appointed two judges in the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court superseding two other judges. They demanded cancellation of the appointments. Later pro-government and proopposition lawyers held a meeting and assigned five senior lawyers to resolve the crisis.

"The bill aims to stop any act of disregard for Father of the Nation by evil forces," said Dewan Farid Gazi, an Awami League lawmaker who piloted the bill. "Dignity of Father of the Nation needs to be protected for the sake of national unity and solidarity."

The bill prescribes three months in prison or up to Taka 10.000 in fines or both for violators of the new law. Such punishments are meant for defaulting top

Opposition out to foil polls, says Hasina

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said the opposition parties are hatching a conspiracy to foil the polls and destroy democracy sensing their defeat in the next general election, reports UNB.

"The opposition parties being scared of the defeat have started destructive activities, they are conspiring to boycott the election to destroy democracy," she told a meeting of Comilla (South) Awami League and its front organisations at Ganobhaban in the afternoon.

She also accused the opposition of trying to destroy the electoral process. "Even the last resort of the people, the highest court of the country, is not free from their attack

and conspiracy," she said. "They do not want the people to get justice, the rule of law to be established, the trial of Bangabandhu Murder Case to be completed," she said blaming the opposition for creating anarchy See page 11 col 7

Dhaka-Yangon survey to ease border tension

Bangladesh and Myanmar have agreed to carry out a joint survey to ease border tension triggered by exchange of fire between BDR and Nasaka on January 8 over construction of an embankment on the Naaf river by Myanmar's border force, reports UNB.

8 killed as bus rams autorickshaw in Gazipur

GAZIPUR, Jan 18: Eight people were killed when a bus rammed an autorickshaw at Sonakar on the Sreepur-Bormi road Wednesday night, reports UNB.

Police said today the Bormibound passenger bus from Dhaka dragged the autorickshaw several yards away. The three-wheeler then caught fire, leaving its driver and seven others dead.

Six of the victims were identified as autorickshaw driver Jamaluddin. 40, and Rafiqul, 40, Badal, 35, Azizul Haq, 45, Hasan Ali, 63, and Al-Farid, 35.

The passengers were traders from Gafargaon in Mymensingh district who came to Bormi Bazar in this district for business.

The incident occurred when they were going to Sreepur rail station for returning home, said one source

No end to passenger woes at ZIA 19 agencies fail to stop pilferage of luggage, harassment By Shaikh Nazrul Islam

failed to stop harassment of passengers and pilferage of luggage at the Zia International Airport, sources concerned said.

More than 10 per cent of the incoming passengers either lose their luggage or find those torn at ZIA. There are such complaints from outgoing passengers also, the sources and victims alleged.

Nineteen agencies are involved in various functions -- mainly security and passenger handling -- at the airport. But there is lack of coordination among them and they blame each other in case of any mishap.

Such incidents have become rampant again although there was a let-up after the authorities took some measures following pilferage of about 5000 Dirhams from the briefcase of a woman, Jarina, who returned home from Abu Dhabi on November 4 last year.

On Tuesday, Bangladesh Biman's Traffic

Helper Mohammad Selim was arrested allegedly for pilfering passenger luggage. Selim was handed over to cantonment police and taken on a two-day remand.

A section of Biman staff is mainly responsible for such pilferage, Selim told police during interrogation.

Police sources said they have collected from Selim a list of Biman employees involved in the crime

When contacted, police officials at the airport said culprits move freely in the 'heavy luggage area' at the Customs Hall as they know that police do not have entrance there.

They said a small police unit maintains security at the canopy and in the area up to the main road.

"Other agencies do not co-operate with us. Employees of the Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh (CAAB) always create trouble inside

the canopy. When a wrongdoer is arrested, they try for his release", one police official said.

A section of CAAB employees including cleaners, belt operators and trolley men are involved in pilfering luggage, they alleged. Sometimes some cleaners also engage outsiders to do their routine duty while they pilfer luggage.

Sources said CAAB is responsible for maintaining security at the airport.

But a senior official of CAAB said, "We have no responsibility regarding luggage handling. We are responsible for operation of aircraft except those of Biman. Biman take care of its own security"

He also said the 'lost and found center' inside the Customs Hall is run by Biman.

As Biman is the only handing agent for all airlines operating to and from ZIA, it is solely See page 11 col 3
