# **Biman's restructuring plan** lands in rough waters Lukewarm response from prospective strategic partners

Bangladesh Biman's restructuring and commercialisation programme has landed in rough waters due to poor response from prospective airlines to become its strategic partner under a World Bank aided project designed by the Citibank group of New York,

sources concerned said. Under the two million dollar programme, the government would retain 51 per cent share of the national carrier, 40 per cent would be sold to a strategic partner (not to be from South Asia and rivals of Biman) and the rest nine per cent Biman would be given to Biman officials

andemployee Since floating of the Request for

Proposal (RFP) to off-load its 40 per cent shares to prospective strategic partners on December 2 last year and extension of the date till January 7, only two airlines have

responded positively. But a number of major airlines from Europe and North America stayed off the RFP, making queries with the Citibank which is working as Biman's privatisation consultants, the sources said.

The restructuring is scheduled to be completed by March this year. So far, the Gulf Air and Qatar

Airways have submitted RFP to the But aviation sources said that a tie-up with the two Gulf airlines,

considered as rivals of Biman in its most lucrative sector, would not promote its business but harm it.

They noted that the Gulf sector is the most profitable sector for Biman with a steady flow of manpower to the Middle East. The second most profitable sector is the Far East and the third is Europe. The US sector

still remains in the red. Biman sought a potential partner with dominance in Europe and Americas such as Air France, Lufthansa, Alitalia, Air Canada and American Airlines which made queries with the Citibank on the

## **Life-saving drugs** in illegal shops DMCH patients 'forced' to queue up at four stores **Star Report**

Most of the patients in emergency ward at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) are 'forced' to buy life saving drugs from four medicine shops adjacent to the hospital, it is alleged

The shops set up illegally on both sides of the entrance to the emerency wing are owned by some 'influential doctors' of the DMCH, who do not have trade licence for this, sources concerned said

The sales at the four shops, kept open round the clock, come to a total of about Tk one lakh even on a 'dull day,' a shop employee said requesting

"Supply of drugs is no problem for us. We get the supply mainly from Mitford drug market,"he said.

Another employee said sales at these shops rise when hospital offices remain closed (2:30 pm to 8am). Patients requiring antibiotics, other medicines and even saline and bandages have to buy those from the

He also said a section of hospital staff steal drugs, mostly life saving ones, from the hospital store and sell those to these shops See page 11 col 6

Peter came here on March 4. 1999 and left on March 10. He stayed at Hotel Sonargaon during his visit. On his return home, Peter was asked to pay four bills in Bangladesh. He then complained to Hotel Sonargaon, which brought the matter to the notice of the then ANZ Grindlays Bank.

The bank filed a case. After investigation, it was revealed that the four bills were sent against his account from places in Bangladesh three Bangladeshi born British citizens have been arrested for their alleged involvement in credit card forgery.

Twelve fake credit cards and a machine to make such cards were confiscated from their possession, sources in Detective Branch of olicesaid
