# Indo-Pak feud to have its say in Asia Cup?

HONG KONG, Jan 20: The fend between cricket bodies in India and Pakistan is believed to have forced the postponement of the flve-team Asia Cup tournament due to take place in Karachi in April, it was reported Saturday, says AFP.

The English-language South China Morning Post quoted Hong Kong cricket officials as saying the tournament - featuring India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh and Hong Kong - would not now go ahead as planned.

Hong Kong Cricket Association official Mark Burns told the paper the one-day tournament would now probably take place in 2002.

"It is 95 per cent certain the Asia Cup, due to be held in Pakistan in April, won't take place. In all probability it will be postponed to 2002," Burns was quoted as saying.


