PCB's way of recovering fines

UNDATED, Jan 23 (Internet report): The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has deducted fines from the salaries of six players as recommended by a judge in his investigations into matchfixing

The fines had been recovered after the deadline for appeals against the punishment imposed by Justice Malik Mohammad Qayyum lapsed, PCB director Munawwar Rana told journalists on Monday.

"We deducted the fines on 16 January, a day after the deadline finished because by that time we had never received any appeals from the players." he said.

A total of 900,000 rupees (15,254 dollars) was docked -300,000 rupees each from Wasim Akram and Mushtag Ahmad and 100,000 rupees each from Saeed Anwar, Wagar Younis and Inzamamul Hag.

The PCB said it would deduct one million rupees from the provident fund of former captain Salim Malik and 100,000 rupees from Ataur Rehman — both of whom were banned for life by the judge. The sum of 100,000 rupees was also being deducted from
