2 corruption cases **Charges framed** against former air chief **Altaf Hossain**

The Special Court for Dhaka Division vesterday framed charges against former Air Force Chief Air Vice Martial (Rtd) Altaf Hossain Chowdhury in two corruption cases.

The judge, Mohammad Fazlul Karim fixed February 28 and March 13 for hearing the two cases.

The accused pleaded not guilty and demanded justice before the court after hearing the charges brought against him.

In the first case, the accused was charged with misuring his official position to ply to his village by helicopter in 1994 that cost the government Tk 12,54,822.25. He had

JBIC governor arrives tomorrow

Governor of Japan Bank for Hiroshi Yasuda will arrive in Dhaka tomorrow on a five-day visit to Bangladesh, reports UNB.

During his stay in Bar Yasuda will meet Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and Finance Minister Shah AMS Kibria.

He will visit the Bangabandhu Bridge and Chittagong Interna-tional Airport as well as the Grameen Bank centres to see the projects financed by JBIC.

JBIC, a government financial

institution, combines and enhances functions of the Overseas Economic Cooperation Fund, Japan (OECF) and The Export-Import Bank of Japan (JEXIM) with a mandate to execute Japan's external economic policy and economic cooperation in an efficient and effective manner.

Bangladesh is one of the largest ODA loan recipient countries, administered by JBIC. Some of the major projects completed with JBIC loan in include Jamuna Multipurpose Bridge and Chittagong International Airport.

Other important projects under the current and future JBIC financing include Paksey and Rupsa Bridge Projects. Rural Electrification and Infrastructure Development Projects, and Greater Dhaka Telecom Project that constitutes about 45 per cent of total telecommunication capacity of the greater Dhaka area have been financed by

The JBIC governor, who will be accompanied by its senior officials, will leave Dhaka on January 30, according to a JBIC press release.

Pahari Chhatra Parishad (PCP) and Hill Women's Federation (HWF) together formed a human chain at the Aperaieo Bangla on the Dhaka University campus at 11:30am yesterday in protest of a 'police attack' on a meeting of United People's Democratic Front (UPDF) at the Chittagong Zilla Parishad auditorium on January 12.

Protesters in the human chain programme that lasted for about half an hour demanded immediate release of those who were arrested from the UPDF programme in Chittagong including UPDF leader Sanchai Chakma.

Police interrogating arrested Rohingya separatists From Staff

CHITTAGONG, Jan 24: Police at Cox's Bazar are interrogating the two arrested Rohingya separatist leaders

Police said efforts are on to unearth clues to their alleged involvement in arms trade and other activities.

Police arrested Salim Ullah. chief of military staff of Arakan Rohingya National Organisation (ARNO) and his aide Nur Mohammad after raiding their headquarters in Chandgao residential area in the city on Sunday night. They were placed on remand for

interrogation, police said. Police sealed the two houses at Chandgao, suspected to have been used by ARNO as its headquarters.

Police said they had recovered a picture of Salim Úllah with Libyan leader Moammer Gaddafi and other documents.

Police are also looking for other leaders of ARNO, an alliance of extremists fundamentalists groups of Myanmar fighting for the independence of Arakan state from Myanmar.

Steps to expunge proceedings against Mohiuddin sought

A demand for justice notice has been given seeking 'appropriate measure for expunging' the criminal prosecution and eventual criminal proceedings against Lt Col (rtd) Mohiuddin Ahmed, one of the accused in Bangabandhu Murder Case, now in death row at Dhaka Central Jail

To justify this, the notice given by Advocate Khan Saifur Rahman on behalf of Mohiuddin's wife cited certain provisions of Fourth Schedule of the Constitution.

Mohiuddin, is one of the 15 former military officers sentenced to death by trial court on November 8,1998 for killing Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and his family members at his residence on August 15, 1975.

Five police officials ranging from sub-inspector to Assistant Commissioner, who were on duty at Saturday's CPB rally at Paltan Maidan, gave their statements to the inquiry committee at the Ministry of Home Affairs yesterday.

The committee headed by Aftab Uddin, Additional Secretary of the Ministry of Home Affairs, told The Daily Star that the officials were questioned to find out about the oopholes in their security cordon.

Seven people were killed and more than 50 others injured in two separate bomb explosions at CPB's Paltan Maidan rally and at Bangabandhu Avenue on Saturday.
