When a diplomat leaves the country, he can take his car or sell it to a local person. But the latter has to pay duties and taxes for changing its yellow number plate and using a black one. But a section of local people

buy luxurious vehicles for diplomats at cheaper prices and use those without changing the number plates. Even if they change those, they allegedly submit forged documents to Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) regarding payment of duties and taxes for fresh registration.

NBR sources further said these cars still having yellow number plates may be used in transporting smuggled goods and in other criminal activities. "If the name plates are not changed, law enforcing agency personnel cannot check those vehicles without permission from the foreign ministry," one source pointed out.


