## **BOA** polls end tamely

The much-talked about election of Bangladesh Olympic Association (BOA) saw all its office-bearers and members being elected unopposed following withdrawal of two member candidates vesterday, reports UNB.

Member candidates Zahidur Rahman Pushkin (Hockey Federation) and Mohammad Ahsanullah (Cycling Federation) withdrew their candidature to avoid BOA polls scheduled for February 1

Renowned sports organiser Zafar Imam emerged as the first elected secretary general of BOA along with nine other office bearers and 25 members of the premier sports body of the country since its inception in

Earlier, on Sunday, 37 intending candidates submitted their nomination papers for the 35 posts. None, however, filed any nomination paper for the prestigious post of president.

After scrutiny on January 22, all the nomination papers were found valid and with the withdrawal of two more member candidates, all the 10 office bearers and 25 EC members were unofficially elected uncontested.


