

Qatar okays peaceful demos at Nov WTO meeting

Qatar has said it will allow peaceful demonstrations at the World Trade Organisation (WTO) ministerial meeting Doha is to host in November, newspapers reported Tuesday.

"We will not prevent anybody from entering (Qatar) to demonstrate on condition that the demonstrations are peaceful. We will allow them to express their views in total freedom," Finance and Trade Minister Youssef Hussein Kamal told reporters.

"We have started preparations to host the meeting," Kamal said,

quoted in Al-Watan newspaper, during a conference on tourism at which plans to ease visas for visitors to Qatar were discussed.

Visitors to the conservative Gulf Arab states need a visa backed by a local sponsor and must state a specific reason for their travel.

The minister's assurance came as the WTO was poised at a meeting in Geneva on Tuesday to confirm the choice of Doha for a ministerial meeting despite criticism of the venue from human rights groups and US trade unions.

When the last ministerial conference was held in the US city of Seattle in November 1999, anti-globalisation protesters rampaged through the streets, seriously disrupting the meeting.

The US-based Human Rights Watch warned this month that Doha, the only candidate as host after Chile dropped out, was an inappropriate venue because of a ban on freedom of assembly in the Gulf monarchies.

US trade unions last week joined the campaign against holding the WTO conference in Doha.

"Once again the cynical and arrogant WTO bureaucrats... think they can run and hide from the deep and abiding problems the WTO has created," said United Steelworkers of America (USWA) president George Becker.

The USWA was among 20 groups to sign a letter to US Secretary of State Colin Powell and Trade Representative-designate Robert Zoellick asking them to oppose Qatar as the site.

The Doha conference is expected to take place November 5-9, ahead of the Muslim fasting month of Ramadan, which slows down life in the Gulf.

ING Barings USA selling to ABN Amro for \$275m

The Dutch bank ING is selling its US banking business, ING Barings USA, to its Dutch rival ABN Amro for 275 million dollars (299 million euros) and is to cut 1,000 jobs, it said Tuesday.

The restructuring would cost 450 million euros and would involve the shedding of 1,000 jobs throughout the world, of which about 500 would be cut in London and 200 in the United States.

ING said it would integrate the European activities of ING Barings

into ING Europe but that it was selling ING Barings in the United States to ABN Amro for 275 million dollars.

The investment banking activities of ING Barings, BBL, BHF-Bank and their subsidiaries would be grouped into two divisions, wholesale and financial markets, which would be managed by the European management committee.

The new organisation would reduce operating costs by about 500 million euros per year.

Indians freeze investment raising plan in Nepal

Violence against businesses

Investors demanding better security from the government have frozen plans to expand in Nepal after anti-India protestors' last month targeted major businesses, a trade official said.

The Federation of Nepal Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FNCCI) vice president Ravi Bhakta Shrestha told AFP that the government's indifference had prompted a rethink among Indian multinationals.

"Fifteen of the (Indian multinationals) have already informed the FNCCI that they would not expand their businesses and would like to take back their investment," Shrestha said.

The list includes Dabur Nepal Limited which markets cosmetics and herbal remedies, Nepal Lever Ltd., Surya Tobacco and Colgate Nepal -- all set up with Indian collaboration.

The firms came under attack in December when left-wing students staged violent protests over mysterious allegations that Indian actor Hritik Roshan had said over television that he loathed Nepal.

Both Roshan and the Star satellite network denied ever airing

such remarks but rioting lasted several days, causing damage to Indian firms estimated by FNCCI at 100 million rupees (1.35 million dollars).

Director of Dabur Nepal Ltd., T.K. Gupta has said his company could not increase its investment as assaults by unidentified vandals was on the increase.

"There is a possibility of increasing investment only if the law and situation is guaranteed to the entrepreneurs," he said.

Investors have told Prime Minister Girija Prasad Koirala and Home Minister R.C. Paudel that they might have to shut shop if lawlessness persisted in Nepal.

They called for the creation of an industrial security force and offered to pay for its mobilisation, drawn from retired army and police personnel.

FNCCI's Shrestha backed the demand, saying, "the government must guarantee security and create industrial security force by amending the relevant act."

Nepal's home ministry has held discussions on the matter.

With Nepal pursuing liberalisation of its economic policies in an effort to attract investments,

the setting up of 554 industries was approved by the end of March last year.

The total fixed capital of these industries was 15.15 billion rupees (206.4 million dollars) while the present value of the projects has been put at 66 billion rupees (899 million dollars), Shrestha said.

Leftist activist Ram Pyakurel said communist and other anti-India groups were aware that closure of industries would shrink job opportunities and hurt the economy but he blamed Maoist insurgents for attacks on businesses.

The Maoists were bent upon destroying Nepal's economy and dismantling multi-party parliamentary democracy, he said, adding most other leftists opposed terrorism.

ROK industrial output growth slows in Dec

South Korea's industrial output growth slowed to 4.7 per cent year-on-year in December from 6.2 per cent a month earlier, confirming the economy is slowing down, officials said Tuesday.

The National Statistical Office (NSO) attributed the slow December growth to sluggish domestic demand.

The output growth for the whole year dropped from 24.2 per cent to 16.6 per cent in 1999.

In December, the industrial output, seasonally adjusted, fell 2.7 per cent from a month earlier, after contracting 1.1 per cent in November, on falls in semiconductor, textile, and food and beverage makers output, it said.

BAT plans to delist Australian unit

British American Tobacco plc (BAT) said Tuesday it plans to delist its Australian subsidiary through a 1.1 billion Australian dollar (600 million US) offer to owners of the remaining 40.5 per cent of the company.

BAT announced the impending disappearance of the last publicly-listed tobacco company in Australia through an offer of 17.75 Australian dollars plus a 45 cent dividend for each share.

"The proposed consideration of 18.20 per share, comprising... the 17.75 dollars and the proposed 45 cent dividend represents... a 40 per cent premium to the one month volume weighted average share price of 13.01 dollars," the company said.

Shares in BAT Australasia,

which was formed in September 1999 through the merger of Rothmans Ltd. and WD and HO Wills Holdings Ltd. soared by 3.80 dollars, or 27 per cent, to 17.70 Australian dollars following the news of the offer.

The company's chairman, Nick Greiner, said BAT Australasia's "share price has significantly underperformed both the market benchmark indices and the ASX alcohol and tobacco index".

"Whilst being the fifth largest listed company by market capitalisation on the ASX, given the low liquidity of the shares, BAT Australasia has been excluded from the SP/ASX 100 index," Greiner said.

"I think it is a factor that some funds as a matter of policy do not invest in tobacco shares.

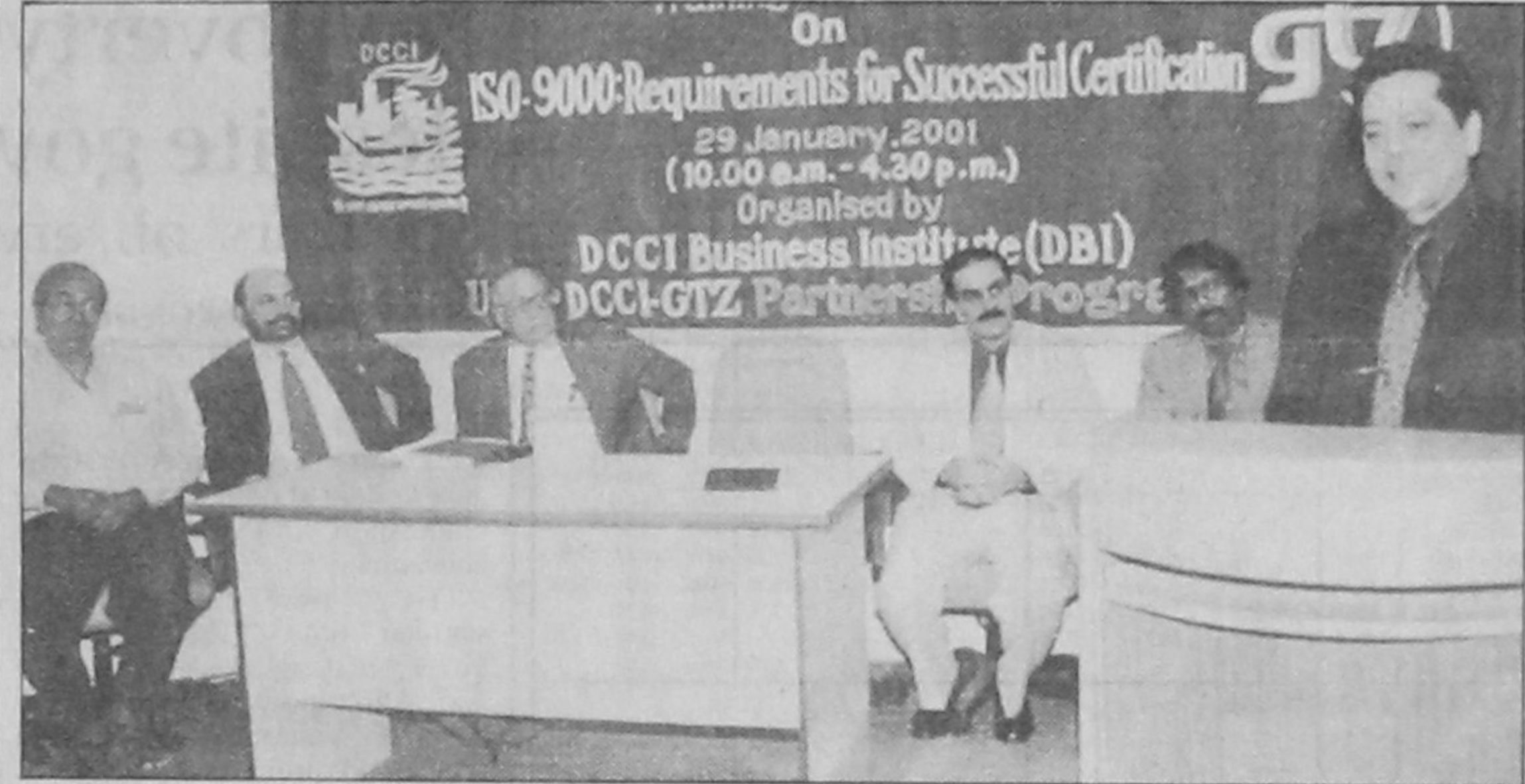
Al Ahalia Money Exchange Bureau opens branch in Dubai

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DaimlerChrysler to cut 26,000 jobs, output

DaimlerChrysler's ailing Chrysler Group announced plans to axe about 26,000 jobs and slash production at 13 plants Monday in a bid to stem heavy losses at the US unit.

The German management team which took over the reins of Chrysler in November 2000 said 6,800 salaried workers and 19,000 hourly workers will be affected.

It hopes to make most of the cuts by accelerating natural attrition by offering incentives for early retirement, but some of the shortfall could be made up by compulsory lay-offs, executives said.

The company's Mexican and South American workforce will bear the brunt of the operation.

The sweeping job cuts, which will reduce Chrysler's global workforce by 20 per cent over three years, are imperative for Chrysler's survival, Dieter Zetsche, Chrysler Group president and chief executive officer told reporters.

Amex notes on Tuesday's market
As the market makers are not selling dollars in the inter bank market the supply of dollar remains low. The USD/BDT rate stayed at the previous range of 54.17-54.19 as the demand was largely unchanged. As there was a mismatch between the T-bills maturity and the amount of acceptance in Treasury bills auction, the average call rate rose to 9.50-10.50 per cent yesterday. However, it fell to 8.50-9.50 per cent today.

The euro found itself earth-bound today as investors bet the Federal Reserve would secure not only a soft landing for the US economy but a rapid re-acceleration as well.

Even the yen managed a four week high on the single currency as another set of moderately positive Japanese economic data made the outlook at home seem a little less bleak.

The Swiss Franc was also stuck in recent ranges as markets waited for the outcome of the US Federal Reserve's policy-setting Federal Open Market Committee Meeting. Sterling was steady against the Dollar today as the market held its breath ahead of a two-day US Federal Reserve policy meeting due to start later in the day.
