Speakers at a recent discussion said that Bangladesh could boost its export of readymade sweater to Europe if the workers in the sweater factories are given adequate and proper training.



The companies are Provati Insurance, City General Insurance, Pioneer Insurance, Meghna Insurance, Mercantile Insurance, Northern Insurance, Bangladesh National Insurance, Homeland Life Insurance and Meghna Life Insurance.
