

India will take part in a one-day cricket series in Sharjah next week against arch-rivals Pakistan and Bangladesh to raise funds for Indian earthquake victims.

"The tour is on," Sharad Di wadkar, executive secretary of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), told this news

Earlier he said the BCCI was awaiting government clearance for India to play in the February 8-11 tournament. Selectors will name the squad on Monday.


