AL peace procession in city against hartal

Hundreds of activist of Bangladesh Awami League and its front organisations yesterday brought out several 'anti-hartal peace procession' in the capital denouncing shutdown imposed by the religious fanatics with support from BNP-led opposition alliance

City Awami League general secretary and State Minister for Shipping Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury Maya, Bir Bikram, led the procession from its Bangabandhu Avenue office protesting the anti-people hartal, terrorism, anarchy, fatwa, and urged people to safeguard country's independence and democracy from evil designs of anti-liberation forces.

The procession paraded different city streets and areas including Noor Hossain Square, Paltan Square, Topkhana Road, Jativa Press Club and the procession concluded at Muktangon.

In a brief rally after the procession at Muktangon, Maya said BNP chief Begum Khaleda Zia is patronising country's religious fanatics responsible for deliberately desecrating the holy Quran by killing an innocent constable inside the mosque. He said people would never forgive them for their heinous crimes and anti-Islamic activities.

The state minister said Khaleda Zia and her allies were involved in the killing of policeman and train passengers near Feni by uprooting the rail track. They are also responsible for the deaths of innocent people by calling frequent hartals.

The hartal call by the Islamic Oikya Jote and Islami Shashantantra Andolan under the banner of "Islamic Law Implementation Committee" and supported by the BNP-led four-party opposition alliance to press home the demand of the release of Moulana Azizul Haque and Mufti Fazlul Huq Amini.

They are facing charges of killing an on-duty police constable, Badsha Mia, inside a mosque during hartal hours on February 3 under Public Safety Act.
