The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) has chosen the Australian Cricket Board (ACB) as its model for future development of the game in the country. In this regard, the two Boards have recently signed a five-year agreement.

This was disclosed by BCB hury during a press conference at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday. Saber returned from Australia on February 14 after attending the ICC Executive Board meeting.

Speaking to the reporters, Saber informed that he signed the deal along with his ACB counterpart Denis Rogers on February 12 at the Australian Board's headquarters in Melbourne.

Terming it as a comprehensive agreement, Saber revealed that Bangladesh cricket would benefit in six sectors with the ACB's as-

The arrangements are as follows:

a) Two Bangladeshi cricket talents will receive scholarships every year for a month-long training stint at the famous Commonwealth Bank Cricket Academy (CBCA) in Adelaide. This will be in addition to the existing two scholarships provided by the Australian Government.


