Bangladesh play Mongolia today

Bangladesh will be seeking some solace when they take on Mongolia in their last qualifying match of the 2002 World Cup at the Fahad-Bin Abdul Aziz Stadium in Dammam today. The match will kick off at 9.30 pm (BST)

Tormented by hosts Saudi Arabia on Saturday, where Bangladesh conceded half a dozen goals without any reply, the boys of George Kottan would be looking for a win to make sure that they avoid the ignominy of finishing last among the four participating teams in Group 10.

Bangladesh scored a 3-0 win against Mongolia in their first leg match on February 12. That was their only victory in an otherwise inspiring first leg, where Bangladesh hold Vietnam to a goalless draw and suffered a 3-0 defeat against the hosts.

But the return leg saw a reversal of fortune for Bangladesh, who swallowed as many as ten goals in their first two games including a 4-0 defeat against Vietnam.
