Amelie Mauresmo won her second title in less than a week, capturing the inaugural Terazura Open before her home fans on Sunday with a 6-2, 6-0 rout of Bulgaria's Magdalena Maleeva. "I didn't expect it," Mauresmo

said. "I played a great match from beginning to end.'

Mauresmo, seeded seventh in the 565,000 dollars event, was coming off a victory in the Gaz de France in Paris, where she beat Anke Huber of Germany in the finals last Monday.

The victory in Paris was her first title in France. Mauresmo defeated Huber again in the Nice semifinals on Saturday, winning 2-6, 6-1, 6-1. Top-seeded Venus Williams

lost to Maleeva in the other semifinal Saturday after receiving treatment for her knee in the second set.

Szabo's time of 8 minutes, 32.88 seconds at the National Indoor Arena indicated that the Olympic and world champion over 5,000 metres appears to be getting quicker.

And Szabo had to run the last seven laps alone because the pacemakers had dropped out and there was no one else anywhere near her as she trimmed .94 seconds off the mark set in March 1989 in Budapest by Dutch runner her victory at the Norwich Union Elly van Hulst.

It's likely to be the same story in her upcoming races.
