The London-based Free Tibet Campaign said in a statement the Games were an "inappropriate reward" for China's 50-year occupation of the Himalayan region. It suggested Tibetan monks had been pressed to sign petitions backing Beijing's bid.

Human Rights in China warned the IOC in a public letter to watch for China's use of its decades-old "custody and repatriation" system to clear streets of But China has struggled to beggars, street children and the homeless and detain them without due legal process.


