The Law Commission yesterday submitted its report on voting rights of Bangladeshi citizens residing

Law Commission Secretary Iftedar Ahmed formally handed over the report to Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Secretary Afzal Hossain Ahmed here, an official press release said.

The Commission, in its report, recommended that it would be proper to register all Bangladeshi citizens residing abroad as voters in the relevant electoral rolls if they are not otherwise disqualified.

If it is decided to enrol Bangladesh nationals residing abroad as voters, the purpose can be achieved by suitable amendment to Section 8 of the Electoral Rolls Ordinance, 1982 (Ordinance No LXI of 1982), it added.

The Constitution says, "Political parties include a group or combination of persons who operate within or outside the Parliament under a distinctive name and who hold themselves out for the purposes of propagating a political opinion or engaging in any other political activity"

The EC's reform proposals include raising the limit of expenditure of a candidate in parliamentary polls to Tk five lakh from three lakh now and strengthening the election tribunals.

It said on December 26, BNP leader M Morshed Khan MP went to inquire about the identity of some youths who had attacked his son over a minor traffic incident. He quickly left. But after the incident a PSA case was filed against Morshed Khan and his son for allegedly stealing cash from a shop.

In contrast, no PSA case was filed against any member of the AL's student front when they incited a riot on December 14 after announcement of the split verdict in the Sheikh Mujibur Rahman murder case. BCL activists had taken to the streets, smashing and burning hundreds of vehicles, and one autorickshawdriverwas shot and killed.

NO PSA charge was filed against photo appeared in numerous newspapers, wielding a gun during the incident, nor against others identi-Vigilante violence against criminals by private citizens occurs. By year's end, official source claimed that vigilante killed one person, compared to 20 persons during the first nine months of 1999.

Press reports of vigilante killings by mobs are also common. Tallying these reports, a newspaper estimated that mobs had beaten to death at least 14 people in May and had killed at least 10 people in June last year. A Santal tribe leader in northern part of the country was killed and dozens others were injured in a mob attack.

According to government figures, 15 persons were killed and 56 others wounded in politically motivated violence during the year.

The report observed that the higher levels of judiciary display a significant degree of independence and often rule against the government. However, lower judicial officers fall under the executive and are reluctant to challenge government decisions. Much of the judiciary is subject to executive influence and suffers from corruption.
