Blast in Chinese 'classroom' fireworks factory kills 60

AFP, Beijing

A huge explosion ripped through a school in east China where pupils as young as eight were forced to make fireworks, killing up to 60 people including many children.

The blast at around 11:00 am local time on Wednesday flattened the two-storey school building in the village of Fanglin in Jiangxi province where an illegal fireworks factory had been set up three years ago, sources said.

Villagers using spades and their bare hands desperately tried to rescue children and teachers from the rubble of the school in Wazai country, many of whom suffered horrific burns.

"I helped them dig out 30 to 40 remain anonymous. bodies. They were all dead, not one was alive. They suffered terribly.
