DCC Mayor Hanif hopes Relief from mosquito menace within 15 days

BSS, Dhaka

Mayor of Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) Mohammad Hanif yesterday expressed the hope that the Dhaka City Corporation would be able to give the city dwellers 'relief from mosquito menace within 15 days.'

Talking to BSS after stepping into the 8th year of his mayoral responsibilities, he said different general strikes and other political programme had disrupted DCC's mosquito elimination drive.

Mayor Hanif took oath on March 12, 1994. He is the first elected mayor of the capital.

"Some of our field workers encountered physical harassment. But delay in the arrival of necessary medicines largely hampered the anti-mosquito campaign," he said.

Mohammad Hanif said when he had announced that Dhaka city would be made mosquito-free, he had little knowledge of the enormity of the problem. The mosquitoes in the city could be controlled, but a total elimination of a tiny insect like mosquito is a very difficult proposition, the mayor observed.

Speaking about 'street hawker issue', the mayor said the hawkers won't be evicted but they would be rehabilitated at some car-

marked spaces.

"I have deep sympathy for the hawkers. But the hawkers are reluctant to go to the earmarked spaces in the capital fearing loss of income," the mayor said.

Hanif said the Corporation has to consider the convenience of the city dwellers and resolve the problem keeping their employment issue in mind. "I have no intention to make the hawkers jobless," he added.

Bangladesh replaces troops in East Timor

Bangladesh is replacing its multi-role engineers' battalion (BAN-ENGR-1) in the United Nations Transitional Assistance Mission in East Timor (UNTAET) with a new unit of 525 army personnel.

The first batch of 180 army engineers led by the commander of the new battalion (BANENGR-2) Colonel Aminur Rahman left the city for East Timor Sunday night. The remaining members of the BANENGR-1 will leave Dhaka next week.

Bangladesh sent the multi-role engineers' battalion last year. Led by Colonel Ismail Faroque Chowdhury, the battalion worked with the mission efficiently and successfully.

Peasants Killing Day Mar 15

BSS, Dhaka

Bangladesh Krishak League, the peasant wing of the ruling Awami League, will observe Peasants Killing Day on March 15, commemorating the killing of peasants who had demonstrated across the country demanding fertilisers in fair price in 1995.

Firing on demonstrating peasants began on March 15 and continued in the following days in which at least 18 peasants were killed.

"Although the production of Urea fertiliser was surplus in the country, farmers did not get the fertiliser even after offering an additional amount of Taka 1000 for per sack of it due to corruption and mismanagement in distribution," a Krishak League press release said.

President of the Krishak League and State Minister for Land Rashed Mosharraf and general secretary Harun-or-Rashid urged all the units to observe the day in a befitting manner.

The day's programmes include wearing of black badges, holding discussions and pasting posters across the country.

A discussion will be held in the capital on the day as part of the central programme in which national leaders and ministers will take part.

Intelligentsia condemn Taliban

The intelligentsia including historians, writers, painters and cultural activists at a meeting yesterday condemned the Taliban authorities of Afghanistan for their "barbaric destruction of historical

icons, museum artefacts and largest Buddha sculptures" in its Bamiyan province.

"Historical sites, monuments, museum objects and statues of any country are, in fact, the cultural heritage of the whole world," a resolution of the meeting said.
