The Election Commission initiated the process of talks with political parties. Terming yesterday's meeting 'positive', the CEC said, "We will ensure fairness at any cost in the coming election. No negligence of duties during election by the authorities concerned will be

In reply to question, he said, "None has raised question about my neutrality. I have proved my impartiality and trustworthiness.

None of the three Election Commissioners however were present at yesterday's meeting.

BNP earlier gave a condition that it would not attend a meeting with the EC if Election Commissioner Safiur Rahman remained present, alleging that he was loyal to the ruling Awami League. Rahman was at his office SEE PAGE 11 COL

# 7 BNP men jailed in Cox's Bazar

Seven BNP activist, six of them are brothers, were yesterday convicted and sentenced to seven vears' rigorous imprisonment each for launching attack on the motorcade of opposition leader Khaleda Zia at Ramu on April 9 last year.

Judge of the special court dealing with cases under the Public Safety Act, Bhabani Prasad Sinha, also fined them Tk 2000 each, in default to suffer another four months of RI.

The convicts are Moslehuddin Liagat Noor, Ashrafuddin Giasuddin, Salahuddin and Mohiuddin, sons of Momtai Mia, and Shamim Ullah, son of Haji Nurul Huda of village Masuakhali Shikderpara in Ramu upazila.

The motorcade of BNP chairperson Khaleda Zia came under attack on its way to Chakoria for a party meeting. The incident took place at Natunbazar on Chittagong-Cox's Bazar highway on April 9 last year in which some 8 cars were damaged.

The incident occurred following internal conflict involving two BNP leaders of the area

18, 1996 and as per law he was produced before court the following day, Huq submitted before the single-judge HC bench, saying that he was reproduced before the court on November 27.

"On no count was he kept in police custody for nine days." as said by senior judge in his judgement, Huq argued and said even if the accused had been with police for eight days, it was an irregularity, but
