### None arrested yet

Police failed to arrest any of the killers of Jubo Dal leader Wahidur Rahman or Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) leader Rashed Sikdar Bachchu till last night. Both men were gunned down in separate incidents in the city on Monday.

Unidentified gunmen shot dead Wahid, 40, president of ward no. 50 unit of Jubo Dal near his residence at about 9:30pm on Monday.

Police, however, picked up a young man named Jewel who had phoned Wahid's house on the previous night to caution him not to leave the house without meeting him first as he had an urgent matter to discuss. Jewel told police that Wahid was not home so he asked Wahid's wife to relay the message to him.

He also said that a person named Khokon might know about the killing. Police looked for Khokon in several places yesterday but in vain.

Sources said three men in lungi -Mamun, Delwar and Mohsin - went to Wahid's house 25 minutes before the killing. Wahid asked Mamun and Delwar, his close door neighbours, to change and come back in five minutes to go out together.

As the two didn't come back in time, Wahid decided to come out of his house and wait for the two, but they didn't show up even after half an hour. Suddenly, unidentified gunmen rushed in riding on motorbikes and shot him point blank in the head and chest, leaving him dead on Sources in the Special Branch of

# NDA, Cong draw battle line

The political scenario in India is set to get surcharged with the ruling alliance led by BJP and the opposition spearheaded by Congress choosing to opt for offensives against each other in the wake of the expose of corruption in defence deals

Following a meeting between Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee and former Defence Minister George Fernandes, the NDA has decided to hold a rally here to express its views on the development that has plunged the government into its biggest crisis since its assumption of power one and half years back. The BJP, whose chief Bangaru Laxman resigned after being

shown in the tapes as taking wads of currency notes he said for "party fund," appears to have decided that offence is the best defence. Alleging that the expose was "a conspiracy to tarnish the NDA's image," the party has asked its senior leaders to tour the country and "educate" party rank and file about what the revelations by the web portal was all about. It is part of a counter-offensive plan, which Vajpayee chose on Monday at a rally of BJP workers in Rajasthan, ruled by Congress, to challenge the principal opposition party to a

She unleashed her strongest attack yet on the Vajpayee government, accusing it of compromising on national security. Declaring that NDA "deserved no mercy," Gandhi said her party would henceforth "fight every battle and every war against the BJP-led government." Significantly, Sonia Gandhi's

speech at the inauguration of the plenary was preceded by adoption of a political resolution, which dwelt at length on the crisis NDA faces and sought to position the party to have a go at power in the event of fall of the Vajpayee government. Scenting power following cracks in the NDA. the political resolution announced a key shift in Congress' hitherto stand of not going for coalition. Acutely conscious of the fact that it alone does not have the majority in parliament, the resolution said the Congress would enter into "appropriate" electoral and coalition arrangements with like-minded But at the same time, the

Congress is careful so as to avoid

giving any impression of being in

the toppling game. A key reason

for this is the Congress' failure to

cobble up an alternative after the

Vajpayee government had been defeated in a confidence vote in March 1999. That was mainly due to serious objections by Samajwadi Party led by Mulayam Singh Yadav and a section of left parties to a Congress-led government. Apparently, the anti-Congressism of Yadav and some Leftist parties persists even today. For the present, the strategy of the Congress, and also perhaps of

the entire opposition, appears to be not to go for the kill right now and instead allow the BJP-led NDA get buffeted by the controversy for some more time. The Opposition is likely to wait for the results to assembly elections due in five states sometime in April and wants to derive maximum political mileage out of scam during the campaign. Out of the five states. Congress has the biggest stake in polls in Kerala, where it wants to regain power dislodging the Left Front, and hopes for a revival in West Bengal and Assam where the party fortune has dwindled over the years. The BJP, on the other hand,

does not have much to look forward to in the elections in those five states, including Tamil Nadu. It is DMK, a key constituent of the NDA, which aspires to retain power in Tamil Nadu and Trinamool Congress, which pulled out of the coalition last week, which hopes to topple ruling Left Front in West Bengal elections. The BJP has marginal presence in the five states and is certainly not in the reckoning for power in any of
