The 38-year-old, who on Monday became the first bowler to take 500 wickets, took his first ever five wicket haul - six for 61 - at this ground as South Africa were bowled out for 287, leaving West Indies with 232 to win. At the close, West Indies were beaten on 23 and 11 respectively.


