The win ended a disastrous three-week period for the tourists in which they lost the second and third Tests and the opening onedayer at Bangalore last Sunday.

The Indians have themselves to blame for a reckless display with the bat despite a career-best 100 from left-hander Hemang Badani.

The hosts threw caution to the winds after electing to take first strike as three batsmen ran themselves out and the others perished to poor shots.

Mark Waugh showed no such indiscretion while compiling his
