The Daily Ittefaq's Staff Reporter Anwar Aldin and The Daily Star's Senior Staff Reporter Moshed Ali Khan won first prize for reports published in Bangla and English respectively. Daily Star's staff reporter Naimul Hossain won second prize for reports published in Bangla and English respectively. Syed Zahurul Abedin of the New Nation and Nikhil Chatterjee, Patuakhali correspondent of Daily Sangbad, winners for reports published in English and Bangla respectively in 1999, also recent their awards. Bail petition of 3 Pakistanis rejected

The Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court, Dhaka yesterday rejected the bail petition of three Pakistani nationals, arrested for their alleged involvement in the biggest ever heroin haul in the country.

The CMM, Shalendra Kumar Adhikari, passed the order after hearing on the petition earlier submitted by the defence lawyers for bail. Court Inspector Abdus Sobhan opposed the petition. The accused - Ibrahim, Rais and Alekjan - were produced before the court during the hearing.

The Department of Narcotics Control (DNC) arrested the three with 24.1 kg of heroin from Hotel Razmoni Isa Khan in the city on September 20, 1999.

Hasina opens new passport office

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday asked the authorities concerned to prepare flawless passports of international standard to protect Bangladeshi nationals from any harassment of foreigners.

Inaugurating the newly built Immigration and Passport Directorate at Agargaon in the afternoon, she suggested that passports could be printed at the security printing press using computer and modern technology instead of printing abroad.

Hasina said a large number of people are going to different countries for employment, higher education, business and treatment while increasing numbers of foreign investors and tourists coming to Bangladesh. "Today, Bangladeshi citizens have been able to create their own positions in different foreign countries by dint of their own merit, efficiency and hard labour. The government has been creating employment opportunity at home as well as encouraging people to go abroad with new jobs."

The Prime Minister said foreign investment in Bangladesh was on the increase following the implementation of pragmatic policy of her government. Investment from the United States alone has gone up to one billion US dollars under her rule from 20.25 million dollars, she added.
