Chappell's no to PCB

Former Australian captain Greg Chappell says he won't pursue a possible offer to become the first foreigner to coach the Pakistan cricket team.

Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) chairman Lieutenant General Tauqir Zia said Wednesday Chappell was one of two candidates being considered for the job made vacant when Javed Miandad was sacked this week.

"We are considering (South African) Barry Richards and Greg Chappell and we are trying to contact them, but nothing has been finalised as yet," Zia said.

"When we talk of a qualified coach to effect good results, why not bring (in) a foreigner."

But Chappell, who is South Australian state cricket manager, said he would not take the position.

"Due to my commitment to the SACA (South Australian Cricket Association), and other commitments, I would be unavailable for the position even if it was offered to me," Chappell said Thursday.

Pakistan sacked coach Miandad on Tuesday and named a 15member coach-less team for the limited-overs tri-series in Sharjah starting on Sunday.

Chappell was interviewed in India last October about coaching the Indian team, a position which subsequently went to former New Zealand opener John Wright.

The Pakistan cricket authorities have given no reason for firing former star batsman Miandad, but there have been reports of senior players refusing to play for him.



The dominance of Australian batsmen on the English County Championship has been emphasised by the appearance of two of them in Wisden's Five Cricketers of the Year.

Justin Langer, who captained Middlesex in 2000, and Darren Lehmann, who plans to return for a fourth season with Yorkshire in 2001, both make the five, which is completed by the presence of Mark Alleyne, Andrew Caddick and Martin Bicknell, in the annual cricketing bible, which hits the shelves on Friday.

It is the first time since 1996 that three English players have made the grade. That year was also the last time that no one from a touring side made the five. The West Indies had toured in 1995, as they did again in 2000, going down 3-1 this time around. No Zimbabwean was judged worthy of the honour, after a 1-0 defeat in their first two Tests in England.

Langer made 1003 runs in 13 Tests for Australia in 1999/2000, including the 223 against India at Sydney which prompted his captain Steve Waugh to describe him as the best batsman in the world on current form. Despite his side finishing second-from-bottom in the Championship, Langer won 230 losing seven wickets in 43.1 praise for his captaincy, and made 1490 runs at 62.08 into the bar-
