Sweden's Fredrik Ljungberg fired home two of Arsenal's goals in a 4-0 thrashing of Manchester City on Wednesday to keep them firmly in the English Premiership relegation

France's Sylvain Wiltord and Nwankwo Kanu of Nigeria hit the other two for second-placed Arsenal, who are now 13 points behind pacesetters Manchester United.

This was City's 11th home league defeat in the Premiership and relegation is looking increasingly likely as they languish second from bot-

Arsenal, in contrast, showed no ill-effects from their FA Cup victory against Tottenham on Sunday and were comfortable winners.

They stormed into a two-goal lead after just nine minutes and were never in danger after that blistering opening spell.

### Radebe sad

Leeds United defender Lucas Radebe spoke of his sadness Thursday at the death of at least 43 football fans killed in a stampede at Ellis Park, Johannesburg on Wednesday.

Nine people were in critical condition and another 89 were still being treated at three Johannesburg hospitals Thursday morning after thousands of would-be spectators surged into an already full stadium Wednesday evening in a bid to watch a derby match between the country's two most popular teams, Kaizer Chiefs and Orlando Pirates.

Radebe, the South Africa captain and former Chiefs player, told the BBC: "When people lose lives like that at a football game it is really. really sad.

"What happened was absolutely a disaster for all the families of all those people who died - a tragedy.

"I spoke to a couple of players and they could not believe what was happening.

## Redondo on way back

AC Milan's Argentinian midfielder Fernando Redondo is slowly making his way back into first-team contention after a season-long injury nightmare - but is still unlikely to return before the end of the current campaign.

Redondo, who joined the San Siro club after inspiring Real Madrid to victory in the 2000 Champions League Final, saw his first season with his new club written off by a knee injury that required surgery on October 3.

And judging by his remarks in the Italian sports press Thursday, he will not be able to return before the end of the season on June 17. people, but held around 60,000.
